Saturday Oct. 25th Commences with strong breezes middle and latter part the same at 7 P.M. spoke Ship Richmond of New Bedford 39 months out with 2000 barrels of Seal from Valparaiso bound home, so end three 24 hours

Sunday Oct. 26th Commences with strong breezes latter part a gale of wind took in sail the watch employed in Ships duty so end three 24 hours no observation

Monday Oct. 27th Commences with a gale of wind from the N W middle and latter part moderate made sail the watch employed in Ships duty so end three 24 hours saw Black fish

Tuesday Oct. 18th Commences with strong breezes from the S W middle and latter part the same, caught two Porpoise the watch employed in Ships duty so end three 24 hours

Thursday Oct. 20th Commences with moderate breezes middle and latter part the same saw White whale Black fish and Porpoise the watch employed in Ships duty so end three 24 hours

Friday Oct. 21st Commences with moderate breezes from the N W middle and latter part the same all hands employed in sending up the Top galant masts and yards so end three 24 hours

Saturday Oct. 22nd Commences with moderate breezes from the N W middle and latter part the same all hands employed in sending out the fly jib Boom, saw Black fish so end three 24 hours

Sunday November 1st Commences with moderate breezes from the W middle and latter part the same saw hump Backer at 7 P.M. spoke Ship Magnet of Warren 39 months out 2000 barrels of Seal the watch employed in Ships duty so end three 24 hours

Monday Nov. 2nd Commences with moderate breezes middle and latter part the same at 5 P.M. saw the main land at 5 P.M. came to an anchor in Talukana Harbour so end three 24 hours

Tuesday Nov. 3rd Commences with strong breezes at 1 P.M. got under weigh and made sail spoke in the Bay Ship Maria Theres of New Bedford and Ballie of Chantucket Bound in so end three 24 hours

Wednesday Nov. 4th Commences with strong breezes at 6 P.M. saw sperm Whales lowered the Boat struck and brand to the Landboard Boat so end three 24 hours

Thursday Nov. 5th Commences with strong breezes from the S W middle and latter part the same still in sight of the Land the watch employed in Ships duty so end three twenty four hours
