fitting rigging saw fin Backs 20 ends these 24 hours

Wednesday June 3^d Commenced with strong breezes
middle and latter part the same all hands employed
in fitting rigging 20 ends these twenty four hours
Lat by obs 02:52 South Long by Ch^m 191:07

Thursday June 4th Commenced with strong breeze middle
and latter part the same at 1 P.M. the C Mitchell saw Sperm
Whale and obtained one, the watch employed in Ships Duty 20 ends
Lat by obs 03:02 South Long by Ch^m 192:17

Friday June 5th Commenced with strong breezes at 7 P.M.
saw Sperm Whale, lowered the Boat but luck got none
at 12 M saw more lowered the Boat did not fasten middle
and latter part strong breezes 20 ends these 24 hours

Saturday June 6th Commenced with strong breezes from
the S.E. middle and latter part the same the watch
employed in Ships Duty 20 ends these 24 hours

middle and latter part the same the watch employed
in Ships Duty 20 ends these twenty four hours

S.E. at 7 A.M. saw Sperm Whales lowered the
Boats and succeeded in taking two one to the Lardard
and one to the L Bone boats at 6 P.M. saw more Whales
lowered the Boats but did not fasten middle and latter
part strong breezes employed in cutting 20 ends these 24 hours

Wednesday June 17th Commenced with strong breezes from
the S.E. middle and latter part equally with rain
all hands employed in coiling at 11 P.M. finished coiling
20 ends these twenty four hours
