

Remarks on Board Ship W^m Hamilton

Thursday June 18th Commences with strong breezes and
equally with rain middle and latter part moderate
the watch employed in Ship's duty so end these 24 hours
Lat by obs 16: 30 Long by Ch^m 180: 28

Friday June 19th Commences with moderate breezes at
5 AM saw Huahine one of the Society Islands at 11 AM
Came to an anchor in the Harbour in Corvair with
the Cleopatra the Island abounds in Coco nuts Oranges
Limes bread fruit Bananas &c the Inhabitants
are very friendly and the harbour one of the best in the World

Friday July 3rd 1838 Commences with moderate breezes
at 3 PM weighed anchor and made sail in Corvair
with the Cleopatra for Bolabola so end these 24 hours

Saturday July 4th Commences with moderate breezes
at 8 AM sent a boat on Shore at Bolabola and
obtained some hogs so end these 24 hours

Sunday July 5th Commences with moderate breezes
at 7 AM sent two boats on Shore at the Island of Mowee
for Hogs four &c ship lying off and on so end these 24 hours

Monday July 6th Commences with moderate wind
the Boats on Shore and obtained more hogs &c at 5
PM made sail and stood to the N W then 8 then

Tuesday July 7th Commences with strong breezes from
the ESE all hands employed in Stowing the anchors and
Chains middle and latter part pleagut so end these 24 hours
Lat by obs 16: 10

Wednesday July 8th Commences with strong breezes
middle and latter part the same the watch
employed in Ship's duty so end these 24 hours
Lat by obs 12: 30 Long by Ch^m 182: 10

Thursday July 9th Commences with strong breezes from
the ESE middle and latter part the same the
watch employed in Ship's duty so end these 24 hours
Lat by obs 10: 05 Long by Ch^m 184: 28 West

on a Whaling Voyage in the Pacific Ocean

Friday July 10th Commences with strong breezes from the
SE middle and latter part the same the watch
employed in Ship's duty so end these 24 hours
Lat by obs 8: 05 Long by Ch^m 185: 29

Saturday July 11th Commences with strong breezes from the
SE middle and latter part the same the watch employed
in Ship's duty so end these twenty four hours
Lat by obs 6: 20 Long by Ch^m 186: 00

Sunday July 12th Commences with strong breezes from
the SE middle and latter part the same the watch
employed in Ship's duty so end these 24 hours
Lat by obs 4: 20 Long by Ch^m 186: 50

Monday July 13th Commences with moderate breezes
middle and latter part the same the watch employed
in Ship's duty so end these twenty four hours
Lat by obs 3: 00 Long by Ch^m 187: 00

Tuesday July 14th Commences with light breezes middle
and latter part the same Caught a porpoise the watch
employed in Ship's duty so end these twenty four hours
Lat by obs 12: 00 Long by Ch^m 187: 10

Wednesday July 15th Commences with moderate breezes from
the SE middle and latter part the same the watch
employed in Ship's duty so end these 24 hours
Lat by obs 20: 34 Long by Ch^m 188: 00

Thursday July 16th Commences with light breezes from
the SE middle and latter part the same the watch
employed in Ship's duty so end these twenty four hours
Lat by obs 20: 16 Long by Ch^m 189: 10

Friday July 17th Commences with light breezes middle
and latter part the same the watch employed in
Ship's duty saw a strong sail so end these 24 hours
Lat by obs 21: 29 Long by Ch^m 189: 00

Saturday July 18th Commences with moderate breezes at 6
AM saw Jarvis Island sent two boats on Shore and got some
wood from an old wreck it is an uninhabited barren Island
so end these 24 hours
