Sunday Jan^y 3rd Commences with moderate breezes middle and latter part strong gale from the S.E. took in the Canvas fore and main topsails and blew reefs the main the watch employed in Ship's duty ends three hours

Monday Jan^y 4th Commences with strong gale from the S.E. middle and latter part moderate made the watch employed in Ship's duty ends three hours
Lat 36:28

Tuesday Jan^y 5th Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part calm the watch employed in Ship's duty saw the North part of New Zealand saw Porpoises caught a tun fish ends three hours
Lat 36:30

Wednesday Jan^y 6th Commences with light breezes and pleasant middle and latter part the same all hands employed in scraping and varnishing the mast repairing the rigging, saw Porpoises ends three hours
Lat 36:12

Thursday Jan^y 7th Commences with light breezes from the West middle and latter part the same the watch employed in Ship's duty saw Porpoises ends
Lat 35:10

Friday Jan^y 8th Commences with light breezes from the Eastward middle and latter part raining at 5 PM spoke Ship Lady Amherst of London 28 months out with 1500 lbs Oil the land in sight ends three hours
Lat 35:14

on a Whaling Voyage in the Pacific Ocean

Saturday Jan^y 9th Commences with light breezes from the Eastward middle and latter part the same laying off the Bay of Islands spoke Ship Sarah and Elizabeth of London full Bound home in Company with the Lady Amherst ends

Sunday Jan^y 10th Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same at 11 AM came to anchor in the Bay of Islands New Zealand ends

Wednesday Jan^y 12th Commences with moderate breezes at 6 AM weighed anchor and made sail for the Curtis Island all hands employed in stowing the masts, sails and the

Thursday Jan^y 13th Commences with moderate breezes middle and latter part the same the watch employed in Ship's duty ends three hours

Friday Jan^y 14th Commences with moderate breezes from the Eastward middle and latter part the same at 12 AM saw a sperm Whale lowered the Boats and fastened to the Starboard Boat and broke the iron and lost the Whale ends three hours

Saturday Jan^y 15th Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same the watch employed in cleaning and drying the Canvas ends
Lat 32:29

Sunday Jan^y 16th Commences with strong breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same the watch employed in Ship's duty ends three hours

Monday Jan^y 17th 1836 Commences with strong breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same the watch employed in Ship's duty ends three hours
