

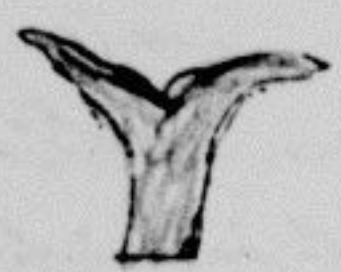
Remarks on board Ship Wm Hamilton

Friday April 29th Commences with moderate breezes from the Northward middle and latter part the same at 2 P.M. finished Peeling, at 1 P.M. spoke Ship Japan with 1000 lbs Oil so ends these 24 hours
Left by 6 24:29

Saturday April 30th Commences with moderate breezes from the Southward middle and latter part the same all hands employed in stowing Oil so ends
Left by 6 24:54 Long by 6 176:00

Sunday May 1st 1836 Commences with moderate breezes from the Westward middle and latter part the same all hands employed in stowing down Oil so ends these 24 hours
Left by 6 25:48

Monday May 2nd Commences with moderate breezes from the Westward middle and latter part the same at 4 P.M. saw 1000 yds Whales lowered the Boats did not fasten, all hands employed in stowing down Oil so ends these 24 hours
Left by 6 25:50



Tuesday May 3rd Commences with moderate breezes from the Northward middle and latter part the same the watch employed in Whips, 10 ends these 24 hours
Left by 6 27:30

Wednesday May 4th Commences with strong breezes from the NW middle and latter part rain all hands employed in working and mending Cloths, 10 ends
Left by 6 27:50 Long by 6 175:20

Thursday May 5th Commences with moderate breezes from the Eastward at daylight saw Pyltarts Island the Barges came off with Potatoes Water melons &c sent the boats on shore and obtained some Potatoes, 10 ends

Friday May 6th Commences with strong breezes from the SW middle and latter part equally with rain took in the fore and main top sails and Close reefed the main at 4 P.M. saw 1000, 10 ends these 24 hours

on a Whaling Voyage in the Pacific Ocean

Saturday May 7th Commences with moderate breezes made sail at 1 P.M. Came to an anchor in the harbour of Tongataboo, 10 ends these 24 hours

Sunday May 8th pleasant one watch on shore on Liberty, Canoes along side with yams and hogs 10 ends

Monday May 16th Commences with moderate breezes from the Southward at daylight weighed anchor and made sail and stood out of the harbour after laying eight days at Tonga and obtaining a supply of bags yams &c, 10 ends

Tuesday May 17th Commences with moderate breezes middle and latter part the same all hands employed in repairing fore sail at 6 P.M. saw Pyltarts Island at 4 P.M. spoke Ship Wm West of Fair Haven 29 months out 1900 lbs Oil 10 ends

Wednesday May 18th Commences with moderate breezes from the Northward latter part rain all hands employed in repairing fore sail, a strange sail in sight 10 ends
Left by 6 27:20

Thursday May 19th Commences with moderate breezes from the ENE middle and latter part the same all hands employed in repairing sails, 10 ends these 24 hours
Left by 6 27:12

Friday May 20th Commences with light breezes at 6 P.M. saw several large sperm Whales lowered the Boats and succeeded in taking two one to the Starboard and one to the Larboard Boats and took them along side stowed the Bow Boat, strange sail in sight 10 ends these 24 hours
Left by 6 27:37



Saturday May 21st Commences with strong breezes middle and latter part strong gale from the Northward laying two under Close reef main top sail with the Whales along side, two urged to cut them in 10 ends these 24 hours
