

Remarks on Board Ship No. Hamilton

Sunday June 8th Commenced with strong breeze from the N.E. at 10 o'clock saw sperm Whales lowered the Boats in Company with the Mitchell and obtained one to the Mitchell Boats and took it to the ship and commenced cutting at 8 P.M. lashed down at 9 o'clock started the whale chain and lost the Whale so ended their 24 hours
Lat 60° 24' 10"

Monday June 9th Commenced with strong breezes from the Northward at 10 o'clock saw several large sperm Whales lowered the Boats in Company with the Mitchell did not part at 6 P.M. spoke ship Rambler of San Francisco 9 months out with 1000 lbs. oil so ended their 24 hours
Lat 60° 24' 00"

Tuesday June 10th Commenced with strong breezes from the E.N.E. middle and latter part the same at 7 o'clock saw a sperm Whale lowered the Boats in Company with the Mitchell parted to one of the other Boats the Whale took a line and went off the strange sail in sight so ended
Lat 60° 21' 10"

Wednesday June 11th Commenced with strong breezes from the N.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in repairing sails saw five Boats so ended their 24 hours
Lat 60° 24' 00"

Thursday June 12th Commenced with strong breezes from the Northward middle and latter part the same all hands employed in repairing sails at 9 o'clock spoke ship Norbury part of Norbury 22 months out with 2000 lbs. oil saw five Boats five strange sail in sight so ended
Lat 60° 24' 40"

Friday June 13th Commenced with strong breezes from the E.N.E. middle and latter part strong gale took in the fore and main top sails all hands employed in repairing sails a strange sail in sight so ended their 24 hours
Lat 60° 24' 20" Long 175° 00"

on a Whaling Voyage in the Pacific Ocean

Saturday June 14th Commenced with strong gales from the E.N.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in repairing sails so ended their 24 hours
Lat 60° 24' 00"

Sunday June 15th Commenced with strong gales middle and latter part moderate made sail at 9 o'clock spoke ship Wicaneet of Wicaneet 24 months out with 1800 lbs. of oil the watch employed in ship's duty so ended their 24 hours
Lat 60° 24' 10"

Monday June 16th Commenced with strong breezes from the Eastward middle and latter part moderate at 5 P.M. spoke Barque Isabella of Fair Haven 10 months out with 800 lbs. oil the watch employed in ship's duty so ended their 24 hours
Lat 60° 25' 40"

Tuesday June 17th Commenced with moderate breezes from the Eastward at 2 P.M. saw a large sperm Whale lowered the Boats did not succeed in taking him middle and latter part the same the watch employed in ship's duty so ended their 24 hours
Lat 60° 25' 50"

Wednesday June 18th Commenced with moderate breezes from the N.E. middle and latter part the same at 7 o'clock saw sperm Whales lowered the Boats and succeeded in taking one small one to the Ross Boat took in alongside and cut it in a strange sail in sight so ended
Lat 60° 24' 00"

Thursday June 19th Commenced with light breezes from the Westward middle and latter part the same all hands employed in boiling at 10 P.M. finished so ended
Lat 60° 24' 10"

Friday June 20th Commenced with light breezes from the Westward middle and latter part the same all hands employed in ship's duty two strange sail in sight so ended their 24 hours
Lat 60° 24' 27"
