

Remarks on Board Ship. *Wm. Hamilton*

Tuesday August 30th Commences with moderate breezes from the Eastward middle and latter part the same all hands employed in cutting and Baling so ends these are the Navigators in sight

Wednesday August 31st Commences with strong breezes from the Eastward middle and latter part the same all hands employed in Baling, saw Breaches so ends these 24 hours the Navigators in sight

Thursday September 1st 1816 Commences with strong breezes and squally with rain latter part pleasant at 1 P.M. finished Baling, Laying of the Island Toomahloa one of the Navigators Canoes came off with Coco nuts Bananas & C^o wood. None of the Navigators in sight -

Friday Sept 2nd Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same still lying off the Island of Toomahloa the Canoe came off with boys & C^o so ends these 24 hours the Islands in sight

Saturday Sept 3rd Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in stowing down Oil so ends these 24 hours the Islands in sight

Sunday Sept 4th Commences with light breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in stowing down Oil so ends these 24 hours the Islands in sight

Monday Sept 5th Commences with light breezes from the Eastward middle and latter part the same all hands employed in stowing down Oil and cleaning out between decks so ends these 24 hours Lat 13° 06' 14.00

Tuesday Sept 6th Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in ships duty so ends

Lat 13° 06' 14.10

on a Whaling Voyage in the Pacific Ocean

Wednesday Sept 7th Commences with strong breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in ships duty so ends these 24 hours Lat 13° 06' 17.40

Thursday Sept 8th Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in ships duty, saw Otatuck one of the Navigators sent a Boat on shore at 1 P.M. spoke Ship Recovery of London 11 months out with 760 lbs Oil, saw the Islands in sight

Friday Sept 9th Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same the watch employed in ships duty so ends these 24 hours Lat 13° 06' 16.00

Saturday Sept 10th Commences with moderate breezes from the Eastward middle and latter part the same one boat on shore at Otatuck at 2 P.M. saw a School of Green Whales covered the Boats in Company with the Navery, fastened to a Calf with the waist Boat and cut from it the W took one Whale, so ends the Islands in sight

Sunday Sept 11th Commences with moderate breezes from the Eastward middle and latter part the same the watch employed in ships duty Three strong sail in sight saw Oron one of the Navigators so ends Lat 13° 06' 14.00

Monday Sept 12th Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same sent a Boat on shore at Oron, Canoe came off with yams & C^o so ends

Tuesday Sept 13th Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same the watch employed in ships duty so ends these 24 hours the Islands in sight
