

Remarks on board Ship. *Alma* Harrildson

Wednesday Sept. 14th Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same at 2 P.M. sent two boats on shore at Open to trade for hogs at 3 P.M. spoke Barque *Wm. Wallace* of Sidney 8 months out with 700 lbs oil at 5 spoke Barque *Victoria* of Sidney 12 months out 700 lbs oil so ends these 24 hours

Thursday Sept. 15th Commences with moderate breezes from the Southward middle and latter part the same at 8 A.M. sent a boat on shore at Open for hogs, soon still lying off the shore

Friday Sept. 16th Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same at 9 P.M. the boat returned from the shore with hogs Coconuts &c three strange sail in sight so ends these 24 hours the Island in sight

Saturday Sept. 17th Commences with strong breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same at 3 P.M. saw a shoal of sperm whales lowered the Boat and succeeded in capturing two small ones to the Bow and took them alongside so ends these 24 hours Sat by 16:09 Long by Ch. 172:00

Sunday Sept. 18th Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in Culling and Baling at 11 P.M. finished Baling Sat by 17:08 Long by Ch. 173:03

Monday Sept. 19th Commences with moderate breezes from the Southward at 10 A.M. saw sperm Whales lowered the Boat and captured two one to the Southward and one to the waist Boat took them alongside and cut one of them in, saw the Island of Varao a strong sail in sight middle and latter part pleasant so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday Sept. 20th Commences with moderate breezes from the Eastward middle and latter part the same all hands employed in Culling, two strong sail in sight so ends Varao in sight

Wednesday Sept. 21st Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same at 10 A.M. saw a large sperm Whale lowered the Boat and took it to the Bow Boat took it a long side and commenced Culling, but was obliged to stop and make sail and stand off from the land all hands employed in Baling a strange sail in sight so ends these 24 hours Varao in sight

Thursday Sept. 22nd Commences with moderate breezes from the Eastward middle and latter part the same all hands employed in Culling and Baling so ends Varao in sight

Friday Sept. 23rd Commences with strong breezes from the Eastward middle and latter part the same all hands employed in Baling at 3 P.M. finished so ends in sight of Varao

Saturday Sept. 24th Commences with strong breezes from the Eastward middle and latter part the same all hands employed in stowing down oil a strong sail in sight so ends these 24 hours the Varao in sight

Sunday Sept. 25th Commences with moderate breezes from the Eastward with rain middle and latter part the same the watch employed in ship's duty so ends Varao in sight

Monday Sept. 26th Commences with light breezes from the Eastward with rain middle and latter part the same the watch employed in ship's duty so ends the Varao in sight
