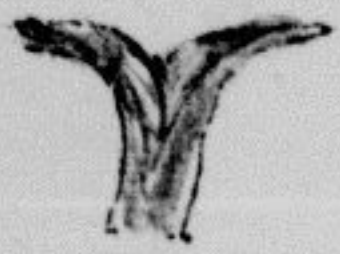


Remarks on board Ship *Wm. Hamilton*

Tuesday Sept. 27th Commences with light breeze from the S.W. with rain midle and latter part the same at 10 AM saw Boats at 1 PM saw sperm Whales several the Boats broken not faster, a strange sail in sight, soon there was a Varao in sight



Wednesday Sept. 28th Commences with moderate breeze from the S.W. midle and latter part the same at 10 AM saw sperm Whales several the Boats and Captained one came one to the Larboard Boat took it along side and cut off the Head, spoke the Whales of Manapitt with 1950 blubber Varao in sight



Thursday Sept. 29th Commences with moderate breeze from the S.W. midle and latter part the same all hands employed in cutting and boiling a Carve came off from one of the small Islands, so ends there 24 hours - Varao in sight

Friday Sept. 30th Commences with moderate breeze from the S.W. midle and latter part the same all hands employed in boiling at 7 PM finished, so ends there 24 hours - Varao in sight

Saturday October 1st 1836 Commences with moderate breeze from the Eastward midle and latter part the same all hands employed in storing down blubber, so ends there 24 hours - Varao in sight

Sunday Oct. 2nd Commences with moderate breeze from the Eastward midle and latter part the same all hands employed in storing down blubber, so ends there 24 hours - Varao in sight

Monday Oct. 3rd Commences with strong breeze from the Eastward midle and latter part the same all hands employed in storing down blubber, so ends there 24 hours - Varao in sight

on a Whaling Voyage in the Pacific Ocean

Tuesday Oct. 4th Commences with strong breeze from the Eastward midle and latter part the same the water employed in ships duty, so ends there 24 hours - the Harpie Islands in sight

Wednesday Oct. 5th Commences with moderate breeze from the Eastward midle and latter part rainy the water employed in ships duty, so ends there 24 hours - Lat. by obs 21:47

Thursday Oct. 6th Commences with strong breeze from the Westward midle and latter part the same at 10 AM spoke the Ship Splendid of Edgerdown 12 months out 200 bl blubber, the water employed in ships duty, so ends there 24 hours - Lat. by obs 21:00

Friday Oct. 7th Commences with strong breeze from the Westward midle and latter part the same, the water employed in ships duty, spoke the Ship Newbumpart 2700 bl blubber, still in Company with the Splendid and - Lat. by obs 20:11 Long by Ch. 171:10

Saturday Oct. 8th Commences with strong breeze from the S.W. midle and latter part the same the water employed in ships duty, a strange sail in sight, so ends there 24 hours - Lat. by obs 19:09 Long by Ch. 170:14

Sunday Oct. 9th Commences with strong breeze from the Southward at 6 AM saw Savage Island the Natives came off in Canoes with Panaman Tools, the Natives are a Savage Race entirely naked, fire strange sail in sight, so ends there 24 hours - Savage Island in sight

Monday Oct. 10th Commences with strong breeze from the S.W. midle and latter part the same spoke Brig Guide of Sydney 17 months out 500 bl blubber, the water employed in ships duty, in Company with the Ships Emory, Clark and Wm. Shannon, so ends there 24 hours - in sight of Savage Island

Tuesday Oct. 11th Commences with strong breeze from the S.W. midle and latter part the same, the water employed in ships duty at 7 AM spoke Ship Missipitt, so ends there 24 hours - Lat. 18:31
