Lat by obs 19.10 Long by Ch^m 171.10

Saturday Oct. 17th Commences with strong breezes from the Eastward middle and latter part the same all hands employed in Boiling at 7 PM finished, we end
Lat by obs 19.12 Long by Ch^m 172.30

Sunday Oct. 23th Commences with strong breezes from the SE middle and latter part the same the watch employed in ships duty, we end these 24 hours
Lat by obs 19.40 Long by Ch^m 171.00

Monday Oct. 24th Commences with strong breezes from the SE middle and latter part the same at 9 AM saw sperm Whale toward the Boat and Captured one to the Starboard Boat took it along side and Cut it in the Whale star the Larboard Boat and Killed John Clemence Larman of Charles town Mass. he joined the Ship at Starboard, and injured two men of the Boat crew, spoke Ship Haverley of New Bedford 16 months out, 700 bl. oil, we end these 24 hours

Tuesday Oct. 25th Commences with moderate breezes from the Eastward middle and latter part the same all hands employed in Boiling, a change sail in sight
Lat by obs 19.20

Wednesday Oct. 26th Commences with light breezes from the Eastward at 10 AM saw sperm Whale toward the Boat did not fasten at 10 AM finished boiling, we end
Lat by obs 19.40 Long 173.00
