Friday Oct. 28th Commences with strong breeze from the Eastward middle and latter part the same at 8 A.M. saw sperm Whales lowered the Boats and Captured one to the Waist Boat took it alongside and cut it in, two strange sail in sight to end these 24 hours

Saturday Oct. 29th Commences with strong breeze from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in Boiling, saw two strange sail in sight to end these 24 hours

Lat by obs 19° 22' Long 179° 22'

Sunday Oct. 30th Commences with strong gales from the S.E. middle and latter part the same Long in the morning a close reef, main top sail and fore sail at 8 A.M. finished Boiling, a strange sail in sight, to end these 24 hours

Lat by obs 19° 26' Long 179° 00'

Monday Oct. 31st Commences with strong gales from the S.E. middle and latter part the same the water employed in ships duty, to end these 24 hours

Lat by obs 19° 11' Long 178° 12'

Tuesday November 1st 1836 Commences with strong breeze from the S.E. made sail middle and latter part moderate the water employed in ships duty, to end these 24 hours

Lat by obs 19° 16' Long 178° 19'

Wednesday Nov. 2nd Commences with moderate breeze from the S.E. middle and latter part the same the water employed in ships duty, to end these 24 hours

Lat 19° 20' Long 178° 20'

Thursday Nov. 3rd Commences with moderate breeze from the S.E. middle and latter the same the water employed in ships duty, four strange sail in sight, to end these 24 hours

Friday Nov. 4th Commences with moderate breeze from the S.E. with squalls of rain at sun rise, saw sperm Whales lowered the Boats did not fasten middle and latter part pleasant, the water employed in ships duty, three strange sail in sight, to end these 24 hours

Saturday Nov. 5th Commences with moderate breeze from the S.E. middle and latter part the same the water employed in ships duty, to end these 24 hours

Lat by obs 20° 11' Long 178° 16'

Sunday Nov. 6th Commences with moderate breeze from the S.E. middle and latter part the same the water employed in ships duty, to end these 24 hours

Lat by obs 19° 52' Long 178° 17'

Monday Nov. 7th Commences with strong breeze from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in stowing Ball, at 5 P.M. saw the Island of Cook, to end these 24 hours

Lat by obs 25° 10' Long by Ch. 176° 04'

Tuesday Nov. 8th Commences with strong breeze from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in Cleaning out between Decks Cleaning Ship, &c. at 10 A.M. spoke the Ship Splendid, to end these twenty four hours

Wednesday Nov. 9th Commences with light breeze from the S.E. middle and latter part the same at 8 A.M. saw sperm Whales lowered the Boats and suggested in taking one to the Waist Boat took it alongside and cut it in, three strange sail in sight, to end these 24 hours

Thursday Nov. 10th Commences with moderate breeze from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in Boiling at 10 A.M. spoke ship Mount Vernon of Nantucket 14 months out 600 Ball, to end these 24 hours
