Monday Nov. 14th Commences with strong breezes from the S.E. middle part squally with rain latter part pleasant all hands employed in hauling two strange sail in sight, so end the 24th hour

Tuesday Nov. 15th Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in hauling at 12 AM finished, so end the 24th hour

Wednesday Nov. 16th Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in stowing oil, two strange sail in sight, so end the 24th hour

Thursday Nov. 17th Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in stowing down oil, so end the 24th hour

Friday Nov. 18th Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same the watch employed in ship duty, a strong sail in sight, so end the 24th hour

Saturday Nov. 19th Commences with strong breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same the watch employed in ship duty, two strange sail in sight, so end the 24th hour
Lat 34° 20' 50" Long 173° 49'

Sunday Nov. 20th Commences with strong breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same at 10 AM saw sperm Whales lowered the Boats and succeeded in taking one to the main Boat and took it alongside three strange sail in sight, so end the 24th hour

Monday Nov. 21st Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in hauling six strange sail in sight, so end the 24th hour
Cove in sight

Tuesday Nov. 22nd Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same at 2 PM finished hauling, took Ship William and Eliza of New Bedford 15 months out 500 blubber, so end the 24th hour

Wednesday Nov. 23rd Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same at 6 AM saw two large sperm Whales lowered the Boats and succeeded in taking them to the Starboard and one to the Bow Boats took them alongside and cut one of them in seven strange sail in sight, so end the 24th hour

Thursday Nov. 24th Commences with light breezes from the S.E. with rain middle and latter part the same all hands employed in cutting and hauling, so end the 24th hour
