Friday Nov 24th Commences with moderate breezes from the Eastward middle part rain latter part pleasant all hands employed in Boiling so ends then 24 hours
Lat 64 22:00 Long 173:40

Saturday Nov 25th Commences with light breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in Boiling at 5 P.M. finished boiling, so
Lat 64 21:10 Long 173:40

Sunday Nov 26th Commences with light breezes from the Westward middle and latter part the same all hands employed in storing Oil spoke Ship Newburyport at 4 P.M. saw 3 sperm Whales toward the Boat in Company with the N.P. did not fasten at sun set saw more Whales did not lower it being too late so ends then 24 hours

Monday Nov 27th Commences with light breezes from the Westward middle and latter part calm at sun rise saw Sperm Whales lowered the Boats and succeeded in taking four large ones, one to the Starboard one to the larboard and two to the Bow Boats took three of them alongside the Newburyport took the other so ends then 24 hours

Tuesday Nov 28th Commences with light breezes from the Eastward middle and latter part rain all hands employed in Pickling and Boiling so ends then 24 hours

Wednesday Nov 29th Commences with light breezes from the Eastward middle and latter part the same all hands employed in boiling still in Company with the Newburyport so ends then 24 hours

Thursday Dec 1st 1836 Commences with light breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in Boiling so ends then 24 hours

Friday Dec 2nd Commences moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same at 4 P.M. finished Boiling all hands employed in storing Oil, so ends
Cove in sight

Saturday Dec 3rd Commences with strong breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in storing Oil at 5 P.M. saw sperm Whales toward the Boat fastened and Draned to the Bow Boat, three strangers sail in sight
Cove in sight

Sunday Dec 4th Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in storing Oil at 6 P.M. spoke Ship. Cortex of New Bedford 28 months out 2000 bl. Oil so ends then 24 hours
Cove in sight

Monday Dec 5th Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in cleaning ship, so ends then 24 hours
Cove in sight

Tuesday Dec 6th Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in cleaning ship, so ends then 24 hours
Cove in sight

Wednesday Dec 7th Commences with light breezes from the Eastward latter part rain at 9 P.M. a heavy Quail called all hands took in fore and mizen top sails and close up the main, so ends then 24 hours

Thursday Dec 8th Commences with moderate breezes from the Eastward made sail at 2 P.M. spoke Ship. Statira of Nantucket 27 months out 1200 bl. Oil the watch employed in storing Oil
