

Remarks on board Ship Wm. Hamilton

Wednesday March 1st 1837 Commenced with strong breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same the watch employed in ship's duty, so ended these 24 hours -
Lat 6° 23' 45" Long 177° 16' W

Thursday March 2nd Commenced with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same the watch employed in ship's duty, so ended these 24 hours -
Lat 6° 22' W

Friday March 3rd Commenced with moderate breezes from the Eastward middle and latter part the same the watch employed in ship's duty, at 2 P.M. saw Coogon -
600 in sight

Saturday March 4th Commenced with moderate breeze from the S.E. middle and latter part the same at 4 P.M. came to an anchor in the Harbour of Tangatua

Sunday March 5th pleasant all hands on shore felled

Monday March 6th all hands working and fitting a new main top galant mast, so ended these 24 hours

Tuesday March 7th strong breezes with squalls of rain all hands working so ended these 24 hours

Wednesday March 8th pleasant all hands getting off masts and stowing it away, so ended these 24 hours

Thursday March 9th pleasant one watch on liberty

Friday March 10th pleasant one watch on liberty

Saturday March 11th Commenced with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same at 6 A.M. weighed anchor and made sail so ended

on a Whaling Voyage in the Pacific Ocean

Sunday March 12th Commenced with strong breezes from the Eastward middle and latter part the same at 10 A.M. saw Pylotarts Island, so ended these 24 hours -
Pylotarts Island in sight

Monday March 13th Commenced with strong breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same the watch employed in ship's duty, so ended these 24 hours -
Lat 6° 23' 19"

Tuesday March 14th Commenced with moderate breezes from the Eastward middle and latter part the same the watch employed in ship's duty, so ended these 24 hours -
Lat 6° 24' 30"

Wednesday March 15th Commenced with light breezes from the Eastward middle and latter part the same all hands employed in fitting the rigging so ended these 24 hours -
Lat 6° 26' 31" Long 177° 00"

Thursday March 16th Commenced with light breezes middle and latter part the same all hands employed in fitting the rigging so ended these 24 hours -
Lat 6° 25' 49"

Friday March 17th Commenced with light breezes from the Eastward middle and latter part the same all hands employed in fitting the rigging so ended these 24 hours -
Lat 6° 25'

Saturday March 18th Commenced with light breeze from the Eastward middle and latter part the same at 1 P.M. spoke Ship Lancaster of New Bedford 28 months out 1800 lbs. all hands employed in fitting rigging so ended these 24 hours -
Lat 25° 30'

Sunday March 19th Commenced with light breezes and calm middle and latter part the same the watch employed in ship's duty, so ended these 24 hours -
Lat 25°
