

Remarks on board Ship *Wm. Harrison*

Monday March 20<sup>th</sup> Commences with light breeze from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in fitting rigging so ends their 24 hours  
Lat by obs. 20° 10' Long by Cal. 174° 30' 00"

Tuesday March 21<sup>st</sup> Commences with light breeze from the Eastward middle and latter part the same at 11 AM saw a large sperm whale lowered the Boat and succeeded in capturing it to the Main Boat and took it along side  
Lat by obs. 20° 29'

Wednesday March 22<sup>nd</sup> Commences with moderate breeze from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in cutting and boiling so ends their 24 hours  
Lat by obs. 20° 00'

Thursday March 23<sup>rd</sup> Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in boiling so ends their 24 hours  
Lat by obs. 20° 10'

Friday March 24<sup>th</sup> Commences with moderate breeze from the Eastward middle and latter part the same at 12 AM finished boiling at 1 PM spoke Ship *Atlantic* of Warburton 14 months out 800 lbs Oil so ends their 24 hours  
Lat by obs. 20° 00'

Saturday March 25<sup>th</sup> Commences with moderate breeze from the N.E. middle and latter part the same the watch employed in ship duty so ends their 24 hours  
Lat by obs. 20° 50'

Sunday March 26<sup>th</sup> Commences with moderate breeze from the N.E. middle and latter part the same at 3 PM saw a sperm whale lowered the Boat and succeeded in capturing it to the Larboard Boat and took it along side, at 6 PM spoke the *Atlantic* so ends  
Lat by obs. 24° 51'

on a Whaling Voyage in the Pacific Ocean

Monday March 27<sup>th</sup> Commences with moderate breeze from the Eastward middle and latter part the same all hands employed in cutting and boiling so ends their 24 hours  
Lat by obs. 20° 00'

Tuesday March 28<sup>th</sup> Commences with moderate breeze from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in boiling so ends their 24 hours  
Lat by obs. 20° 10'

Wednesday March 29<sup>th</sup> Commences with moderate breeze from the S.E. middle and latter part the same at 3 PM saw a sperm whale lowered the Boat and took it to the main Boat and took it along side two strange sail in sight so ends their 24 hours  
Lat by obs. 20° 56' Long 177° 10'

Thursday March 30<sup>th</sup> Commences with strong breeze from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in boiling a strange sail in sight so ends their 24 hours  
Lat by obs. 20° 11'

Friday March 31<sup>st</sup> Commences with strong breeze from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in boiling at 5 PM finished so ends their 24 hours  
Lat by obs. 20° 16'

Saturday April 01<sup>st</sup> 1837 Commences with strong breeze from the S.E. middle and latter part the same all hands employed in storing down Oil so ends their 24 hours  
Lat by obs. 24° 30'

Sunday April 02<sup>nd</sup> Commences with strong breeze from the middle and latter part the same the watch employed in ship duty so ends their 24 hours  
Lat by obs. 25° 00'

Monday April 03<sup>rd</sup> Commences with strong gale middle and latter part the same at 4 PM saw sperm whale did not lower the Boat it being too rough all hands employed in storing down Oil being too under a close reef main top sail O. so ends
