

Remarks on board Ship Wm. Hamilton

Monday May 22^d Commences with strong breezes from the South middle and latter part squally with hail the watch employed in ship's duty so ends the 24 hours
Lat 45° 55' S Long 46° 48' E

Tuesday May 23^d Commences with strong gale from the S by E at 4 AM took in the main sail and close up the top sails middle and latter part the same so ends the 24 hours
No observation

Wednesday May 24th Commences with strong gale from the S by E middle part rain and foggy middle and latter part the moderate made all sail so ends the 24 hours
Lat 46° 10' S

Thursday May 25th Commences with moderate breezes from the S by E with rain middle and latter part the same the watch employed in ship's duty so ends the 24 hours
No observation

Friday May 26th Commences with strong breezes from the S by E with rain middle and latter part the same the watch employed in ship's duty so ends the 24 hours
Lat 46° 49' S Long 102° 10' E

Saturday May 27th Commences with moderate breezes from the N by E Course S by E latter part strong breeze from the North took in the top galant sails so ends the 24 hours
Lat 46° 51' S Long 99° 20' E

Sunday May 28th Commences with strong gale from the North at 4 AM took in the main sail and double reefed the top sails middle and latter part rain from the N by E and
Long 96° 10' E

Monday May 29th Commences with light breezes and rain from the N by E middle part strong gale from the N by E Course S by E latter part moderate made all sail so ends the 24 hours
Lat 53° 49' S Long 98° 17' E

From New Zealand towards New Bedford

Tuesday May 30th Commences with strong breezes from the West Course S by E at 4 AM took in the top galant sails jib and main sail and double reefed the fore and mizen top sails at 11 AM set main top galant sail so ends the 24 hours
Lat 46° 32' S Long 69° 50' E

Wednesday May 31st Commences with moderate breezes from the S by E Course S by E made all sail latter light breezes from the East wind with rain so ends the 24 hours
Lat 47° 00' S Long 87° 00' E

Thursday June 1st 1837 Commences with moderate breezes from the Eastward with rain middle and latter part strong gale took in the top galant sails and double reefed the top sails at
Lat 47° 20' S Long 87° 00' E

Friday June 2^d Commences with strong gale from the Southward at 11 AM set single reef main top sail and top galant sail middle and latter part moderate breezes made all sail Course East so ends the 24 hours
Lat 46° 57' S Long 87° 17' E

Saturday June 3^d Commences with moderate breezes from the Southward Course S by E middle and latter part the same the watch employed in ship's duty so ends the 24 hours
Lat 46° 57' S Long 87° 17' E

Sunday June 4th Commences with moderate breezes from the South latter part strong breeze from the North with rain at 8 AM passed a King Maning N by E at 10 spoke the Britannian
Lat 46° 49' S Long 68° 10' E

Monday June 5th Commences with strong gale from the N by E with rain took in the top galant sail jib and main sails and mizen top sail and double reefed the fore and main latter part moderate made all sail so ends the 24 hours
Lat 46° 17' S Long 68° 15' E

Tuesday June 6th Commences with strong breezes from the N by E Course N by E at 4 AM took in fore and mizen top galant sails latter part moderate made all sail so ends the 24 hours
Lat 54° 13' S Long 60° 20' E
