

Ship Monday 1 st	William Hamilton Bound to the Pacific Begins with hard gale & rain from the S.W. heading East at 5 P.M. wind from the West turned out the sails & set the main top gallant sail with a heavy swell from all points of the compass Middle & latter part clear. Saw black fish Lat 40, 21, Long 64, 15.
Tuesday 2 nd	Begins with strong breezes from the N.W. Course East by N Middle & latter part thick & rainy took in an made sail accordingly Lat by obs 40, 14, Long 61, 50.
Wednesday 3 rd	Commences with moderate breezes from the S.W. heading up S.E. at 5 saw black fish lowered the boats but did not fasten Middle part equally at 11 A.M. took in the fore & main top sail latter part strong breezes from the N.W. Course from S.E. by E. to East by South, at 2 P.M. saw a ship steering East so ends then 24 hours Lat by obs 40, 23, Long 54, 20.
Thursday 4 th	Begins with moderate breezes from the N.W. Course East at 5 P.M. spoke with the Logan and double reefed the top sail for the night Middle & latter part moderate breezes from the N.W. at 5 A.M. made sail & sail in sight Lat by obs 37, 54, Long 52, 10.
Friday 5 th	Commences with moderate breezes from the S.E. up S.W. with all sail set the Logan & one more sail in sight Saw five backs & porpoises and looked hard for a sperm whale Middle & latter part moderate breezes at 7 P.M. saw a Steam Ship or Boat steering E. by S Ship Logan & a strange sail in sight steering East Lat by D.R. 37, 15 Long 54.
Saturday 6 th	Commences with moderate breezes from the S.W. Course S.E. with all sail set Saw five backs Middle & latter part pleasant Course S.E. by S winds variable

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Sunday 12 th	Begins with moderate breezes from the S.W. Course S.E. by E. with all sail set steering East at below 5 A.M. saw sperm whale lowered the boat at being late did not fasten light airs from all parts of the compass one brig in sight steering East Lat by obs 37, 27, Long 53, 20.
Monday 13 th	Commences with light airs & calm at 2 P.M. saw sperm whale lowered the boat but did not fasten at 5 A.M. spoke the Ship Augusta of Bath 10 days from Havre bound to Charleston, at 10 past a brig steering East, so ends Lat by obs 37, 47, Long 54, 20.
Tuesday 14 th	Commences with moderate breezes the S.E. heading East with all sail set saw breeches to the windward, could not determine what they were, at 4 wind at S.E. tacked Ship to the South Middle part rainy at 7 P.M. tacked Ship heading S.E. Hard times Lat by obs 37, 34, Long 52, 33.
Wednesday 15 th	Commences with moderate breezes from the S.W. steering S.E. by E. at 1 saw black fish lowered the boat but could not fasten Middle & latter part strong breezes from the S.W. Course S.E. all sails set to the best advantage Logan in company. 1 strange sail in sight Lat by D.R. 36, 42 Long by D.R. 50, 15.
Thursday 16 th	Commences with moderate breezes from the S.W. Course S.E. by E. all sail set at 7 P.M. spoke with the Logan & steered E. by E latter part wind from S.E. by E. heading S.E. by E. 1 strange sail in sight Lat by D.R. 36, 30 Long 50, 10.
