Saturday 2 nd	Commenced with fresh gales & thick weather at 5 P.M. took in the fore & main top sail & doubled reefed the main for the night, at 8 P.M. made sail & saw black fish, Lat 22.28 Long 20.21
Sunday 3 rd	Strong gales from the N.E. at 6 P.M. took in the fore & main top sail, & doubled reefed the main. Saw a ship standing to the S.E.W. with all sail set Middle & latter part the same, at 8 P.M. made sail, Course S.E., Lat 20.44 Long 18.27
Monday 4 th	Commenced with hard gales from the N.E. at 6 P.M. grounded & got no bottom, at 5 P.M. changed our course for the Cape de Verde Islands, Course W.S.W., Lat 19.34 Long 19.52,
Tuesday 5 th	Commenced with hard gales from the N.E. Middle & latter part the same 6 P.M. S.W., Lat 17.41 Long 21.28
Wednesday 6 th	Commenced with strong breeze from the S.E. starting for the Isle of Gales at 1 P.M. bore to heaving to the South at daylight kept of west at 2 P.M. saw the Island of Bonaville & at 12 came at anchor in the harbor.

Monday 11 th	Commenced with light winds & pleasant weather. Middle & latter part the same at 12 saw black fish se. ends, winds N.E., Course S.P.M., Lat 12.12 Long 18.42.
Tuesday 12 th	Commenced with light winds & fine weather. Saw black fish landed 3 boats & took 2 fish & took them in Middle & latter part the watch employed in boiling them out wind N.W. Course S.P.M., Lat 12.07 Long 20.35 W.
Wednesday 13 th	Commenced with light winds & pleasant weather. Middle & latter part the same, Land W. Course S.P.M., Lat 11.31 Long by Celestial 20.45
