Thursday Nov. the 15th
Commenced with hard gales from the West
Middle part the same latter part from the
N. E. at 2 P.M. set the fore sail heading
N. E. at 3 P.M. Lat. 43° 35' S

Friday, Nov. the 16th
Commenced with hard gales from the S. E.
the ship heading N. E. at 6 A.M. were
ship to the S. E. at 5 P.M. commenced
writing the Whales light rigging.
Lat. 44° 12' S.

Saturday, Nov. the 17th
Commenced with light breezes from the
west at 10 A.M. sailing at 1 P.M. Woodard
sail took in the bow sail & turned up the
mast boat the ship heading S. E. Middle
part the same latter part wind from the N. E. at
thick & rainy.

Sunday, Nov. the 18th
Commenced with hard gales from the N. E. at
heading South under a close reefed main top
sail fore sail & fore spancer at 6 P.M. set double
top sail.
Lat. 44° 36' Long. 174° 00'

Monday, Nov. the 19th
Commenced with hard gales from the N. E. at
heading N. E. by N. under double reefed top
middle & latter part more moderate at 6 P.M.
were ship to the S. E. Lat. 44° 09' South

Tuesday, Nov. the 20th
Commenced with light winds from the S. E. at 1 P.M.
Whole the ship. Reuben Jones 25. Minck 2000 lbs. good
latter part strong breezes from the S. E. with rain
in Company with the ship

Wednesday, Nov. the 21st
Commenced with fresh breezes from the S. E. with
rain in Company with the Jones Middle & hard gales
from the S. E. Latter part more moderate
heading N. E. at 4 P.M. under a close reefed main top sail
Lat. 44° 17' Long. 174° 38' East

Thursday, Nov. the 22nd
Commenced with fresh breezes from the S. E. at
3 P.M. were ship to the S. E. at double reefed
top sail fore sail & main spancer the Jones
in Company, latter part strong breezes from the N. E.
with rain. Course N. E. by N. at 4 P.M. took
in the fore & main top sail.

Friday, Nov. the 23rd
Commenced with strong breezes from the N. E.
with rain Middle part wind from the N. E. at
heading S. E. Jones in Company, latter part wind
S. E. & Course N. E. by N. at 8 P.M. saw
Whitman Island brought the ship to the wind
heading S. E.

Saturday, Nov. the 24th
Commenced with fresh breezes from S. E. at 1
P.M. set double reefed top sails heading S. E.
at 5 P.M. were ship to the S. Middle
& latter part light winds at 10 P.M. sent 2
boats on shore for fish. Caught a boat full
about 3 hundred.

Sunday, Nov. the 25th
Commenced with pleasant weather at 10 P.M.
saw sperm Whales lowered the boat the waist
struck took the Whales along side the Jones
in Company, took one Whale
