

Remarks on board of the Ship William Hamilton.

Friday, June the 21st.
Commences with light winds & calm. at 2 A.M. saw black jet
covered the boats & took three latter part strong breezes
heading in N.E. for the land.

Saturday, June the 22nd.
Commences with strong breezes heading in for the land
at 4 tacked ship heading off shore to the S.E. at 6
shortened sail latter part equally with rain at 8 P.M.
tacked in shore to the S.E. & ends

Sunday, June the 23rd.
Commences with strong breezes from the S. at 2 P.M.
there was 24 Canoes along side trading yams for iron
hooks at 4 P.M. stood off shore under short sail
at 7 tacked in shore at 8 the Canoes came of trading.

Lat. 10. 30. S. Long. 158. 00

Monday, June the 24th.
Commences with strong gales still lying under
the lee of the land trading with the natives they appear
to be friendly but never trust a native so ends.

Tuesday, June the 25th.
Commences with strong breezes still trading. middle &
latter part standing off shore several islands in sight.

Wednesday, June the 26th.
Commences with strong breezes middle & latter part light
still trading for yams the pay was iron hoops
so ends on trade.

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Thursday, June the 27th.
Commences with light breezes & calm standing off shore middle
& latter part strong breezes the heading to the S.E. the land in
sight.

Friday, June the 28th.
Commences with strong gales from the S heading S.E.
under double reefed top sails middle & latter part the same

Saturday, June the 29th.
Commences with strong gales from the S.P.E. heading
S by E. under single reefed top sails latter part light breezes
course S.E. saw finbacks

Lat. 15. 31. S. Long. 158. 51. East

Sunday, June the 30th.
Commences with light breezes from S.P.E. heading
S by E. latter part
latter part strong gales. course S.E.

Lat. 17. 59. S. Long. 159. 20

Monday, July the 1st.
Commences with strong gales from S.E. Course W.P.W.
middle part equally with rain latter part light breezes
from the W.P.W.

Lat. 18. 30. S. Long. 158. 25. E.

Tuesday, July the 2nd.
Commences with light breezes from the W.P.W. heading to
the S. the watch employed in securing up the main
scaffolding saw finbacks & porpoises.

Lat. 18. 44. S. Long. 158. 46. East
