

Remarks on board of the Ship, William Hamilton, February, the 4th 1841.

Friday, Feb. the 5th
Commences with light breezes from the S steering N N W
latter part N W by S. saw black fish the watch employed in ships duty
Lat. 32.40. S Long 172.40. W

Saturday, Feb. the 6th
Commences with light breezes from the S steering N N W
saw pumps Middle part wind from the E latter part
steering N N W the Omega in Company, so ends
Lat. 32.24. S

Sunday, Feb. the 7th
Commences with light breezes from the S steering N N W
Middle part steering N latter part S by E. at 9 saw french
boats so ends
Lat. 31.31. Long. 172.71

Monday, Feb. the 8th
Commences with strong breezes from the E at 2 spoke the
Star of Hope of Hantel Feb 21. Months out with 200 lbs.
latter part strong breezes from the N steering N N W. at 3 saw
maulby hook the Omega in Company, saw pumps so ends

Tuesday, Feb. the 9th
Commences with strong breezes from the N steering N N W
under short sail latter part all hands employed in stowing
down Feb so ends
Lat. 29.12. S

Wednesday, Feb. the 10th
Commences with strong breezes from the N steering
N N W. at 6 finished stowing down the Omega in sight
latter part light breezes & cloudy so ends
Lat. 27.48. S

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Thursday, Feb. the 11th
Commences with moderate breezes from the S steering N N W
latter part from the E steering breezes so ends
Lat. 26.27

Friday, Feb. the 12th
Commences with strong breezes from the S steering N N W
saw black fish latter part wind from the E. so ends East
Lat. 24.29. S Long. 173.27

Saturday, Feb. the 13th
Commences with strong breezes from the E steering N W
by N latter part W by S. weather smoky so ends
Lat. 23.15. Long. 173.26

Sunday, Feb. the 14th
Commences with strong breezes from the E steering N
by S. at 6 spoke the Omega, Middle & latter part light
rain wind S E.
Lat. 23.01. S Long. 174.50

Monday, Feb. the 15th
Commences with high breezes from the S steering N by E
pleasant Middle & latter part the same so ends
Lat. 23.01. S Long. 174.30

Tuesday, Feb. the 16th
Commences with strong breezes from the S steering N by E
the Omega in sight at 6. P.M. saw sperm whales toward
the Spitz street & the harbor of quarter & labour boat 4 each
took them along side & cut them in, so ends

Wednesday, Feb. the 17th
Commences with light breezes from the E, at 2 began to sail
Quarters Island in sight to the leeward at 6. took in sail
heading N Middle & latter part rainy stop boiling heading S E
