Tuesday, April the 19th

Commenced with light breezes from S.E. steering N by E. the watch employed in unloading the fore & main Royal Yards, & flying Gull-boom at 10. A.M. saw a large steering S.W. latter the watch employed in repairing sails so ends.

Lat. 24. 55. S. Long. 36. 18. W.

Wednesday, April the 20th

Commenced with light breezes from S.E. steering N by E. Middle & latter part the same at 6. A.M. saw large steering S.W. so ends.

Lat. 22. 12. S. Long. 31. 00. W.

Thursday, April the 21st

Commenced with light breezes from S.E. steering N by E. sent the main sky sail yards & set the Cambruse for yards. Middle light breezes from the E. heading N by E. latter light breezes from the N.E. heading N.W. so ends.

Lat. 21. 31. S.

Friday, April the 22nd

Commenced with light breezes from the N. heading W by N. at 1. A.M. packed ship heading S by E. Middle winds N.W. heading S.W. latter winds W.S.W. steering N by E. with all sail set

Lat. 20. 35. S. Long. 31. 42. W.

Saturday, April the 23rd

Commenced with light breezes from the N. steering N by E. with all sail set. Middle & latter N.W. winds S.W. so ends. Lat. 17. 10.

Sunday, April the 24th

Commenced with moderate breezes from the S. steering N. with studding sails set both sides below & aloft. with light rain the watch employed in fitting the spars & latter S by E. so ends.

Lat. 15. 10. S. Long. 22. 16. W.

Monday, April the 25th

Commenced with fresh breezes from S by E. steering N. with the studding sails set below & aloft. Middle & latter part the same so ends.

Lat. 12. 17. S. Long. 23. 09.

Tuesday, April the 26th

Commenced with strong breezes from S.E. steering N. Middle winds from the E. took in sails latter light breezes & calm with rain so ends. No Obs.

Wednesday, April the 27th

Commenced with light breezes & calm with rain round Parable Course N. latter S.W. saw a large steering to the N. the watch employed in rattring the fore & main rigging so ends.

Lat. 8. 26. S. Long. 23. 18. W.

Thursday, April the 28th

Commenced with light from the S.W. steering N.W. Middle winds. Variable with rain latter moderate breezes from the S.E. all sail set at 6. saw the land saw one big & several small Craft. the watch employed in fitting rigging so ends.

Lat. 6. 49. S. Long. 24. 40

Friday, April the 29th

Commenced with light breezes from S.E. steering N.W. along shore at 5. rounded in 1/2 fathoms of water sandy bottom. April 30. Miles Distance. Middle & latter light breezes from the E. the watch employed in fitting the rigging so ends.

Lat. 4. 50. S.

Saturday, April the 30th

Commenced with light breezes all round the Horns with plenty of rain lost sight of the land Middle & latter part the same so ends.
