Thursday April 20 1865

first part light baffling winds with thick fog
 later part Clear weather with light N wind
 steering for the south end of Staten Island
 which was distant 20 miles at 10 AM
 at 9 in the evening ran into Ice hauled by
 the wind to the southward at this time commenced
 blowing a heavy gale from East with snow and
 rain the ship sails and rigging was lashed with ice
 so we could not make the braces
 later part of the night blowing at times so fast
 that the sails and most of the gear
 at daylight found the ship off at sea shore
 breakers 5 mile distant at 6 morning wind
 hauled N W

Friday April 21 1865

all the 24 hours strong N W gales ship lying
 the wind off Staten Island

Remarks Monday April 24 1864

all these 24 hours strong Easterly wind part
 of the time thick weather
 came in to the Sea of Ochlock by the south
 End of American Island saw some Ice

Remarks April 26 came up to the Ice
 in lat 50 or N long 130 30 E but did not heavy
 started off to the Eastward to get sound of
 24 spoke ship Josephine and bark of Ludens
 started in to the N through the Ice
