Nov 23 1866

Friday Dec 28 1866 all these 24 hours strong westerly
wind steering to the S. under easy sail at 4 P.M.
Saw ship Milton and bark Napoleon of New Bedford
both cutting. I wish I could find a whale to cut
all I can do is to keep looking

Lat 33 20 South

Long 18 00

Saturday Dec 29 1866 all these 24 hours strong westerly
wind saw 2 ships to the Eastward whaling run for them
at 5 P.M. lowered 2 boats. What boat struck at 3 P.M.
got the whale to the ship think he will make 20 barrels
or more saw the ship Milton took one

Lat 33 26 N Good Luck

Long 17 46 W

Sabbath 30 1866 all these 24 hours light westerly wind
with pleasant weather at 10 A.M. fired cutting ship Milton
in sight cutting and boiling

Lat 33 48

Long 17 30 W
