Monday the Last of 1866 a beautiful day Ship heading
 to the N. W. under easy sail employed hauling think my
 Whales want make over 60 barrels so good bye also repeat again have
 been a kind eye to me and mine nothing but good health and
 Prosperity wish I am very thankful for to the God above
 Lat 32° 38' Long 179° 03' West

Tuesday January 1st 1867

all these 24 hours strong Westerly wind ship heading
 to the Southwest spoke ship Milton and Napoleon so commenced
 the New Year
 Lat 32° 40' S
 Long 179° 30' West

Friday Jan 4 1867

all these 24 hours light baffling winds at 12 AM saw
 whales lowered 3 boats Subboarded boat struck at 4 PM got the
 whale to the ship there good Luck 60 barrels of
 oil
 Lat 33° 40'
 Long 179° 30' East

Saturday Jan 5 1867

all these 24 hours strong N. E. winds employed cutting at
 1 PM finished spoke ship Josephine of New Bedford
 I was well pleased to see Capt Chapman & he & the vessel
 Acquaintance I have this side of Cape Horn
 at 6 PM commenced business
 Lat 33° 22' S
 Long 179° 48' East

Sunday Jan 6 1867

all these 24 hours strong N. E. wind steering S. E. employed
 hauling had to put my whale in haygo so I could have the
 cork for oil
 Lat 34° 15' S
 Long 179° 50' E
