all these 24 hours light baffling winds and pleasant weather Steering N N W passed at 10 miles from the point of the day distant 20 miles passed Cape Horn the 6 of the month saw small sperm whales could not strike

Second mate one boat hook and cook sick of duty

Remarks Saturday 9 67

all of these 24 hours fresh S W wind Steering N N W all sail set showed signals with both R & W of Honolulu

Lat 33 21 S Long 133 30 E

Remarks Sunday 10 1867

all these 24 hours strong West wind with pleasant weather Steering North by compass all sail set

Lat 49 15 0 Long 161 25 W

Remarks Monday 11 1867

all these 24 hours light N W wind with pleasant weather heading N N E by the wind

Lat 46 04 S Long 159 25 E

Remarks Tuesday 12

all these 24 hours light baffling winds heading N N E most of the time caught 3 porpoises

Lat 44 16 S Long 154 54 E

Remarks Wednesday February 13 67

all these 24 hours fresh Easterly wind with thick hazy weather Ship heading N by the wind under short sail

Lat 41 39 S Long 156 30 W

Remarks Thursday 14 67

all these 24 hours strong East wind with sun ship heading N N E by the wind passed at 10 miles from the point of the day distant 20 miles passed Cape Horn the 6 of the month saw small sperm whales could not strike
