

Remarks on Board Bark Bertha of New Bedford Mass 1877.
Monday April 22nd

Lying at Anchor in Dominica Employed in Painting Ship outside and painting out the after hole for Provision at 11 A.M. two Humpbacks Whales come into the Harbor. Looked the Boat for them but without success at 4 P.M. the boat came on board so much the day with rain the Cooper Sailed at Night Anchor Watch

Tuesday April 23rd

Lying at Anchor in Dominica Employed in Painting the after hole at 7. Commenced to Rain at 4 P.M. the Rain closed up Employed in Painting Ship but felt Oscar Adams and Walter Handy Sailed at Night Anchor Watch

Wednesday April 24

Lying at Anchor in Dominica Employed in Painting Ship outside and getting water and wood and Stowing it down at 6 A.M. closed up the Decks and part of the crew went for provisions at 9 P.M. George Adams and William H. Collins left. Hand on Duty at gun and also the Cooper. with seeing Weather at Night Anchor Watch

Thursday April 25th

Lying at Anchor in Dominica Employed in Painting Ship inside all and taking on board wood and water at 6 P.M. P.M. closed up the Decks and the crew sent for provisions till 11 A.M. Sailed at Night Anchor Watch Collins and George Adams on Duty at gun

Friday April 26th

Lying at Anchor in Dominica Employed in getting on Board Water and Stowing it down and Working Ship in Side at 10 P.M. the Brig D. B. Small came in and Anchored. Fred Deane Sailed and also Manuel Polaris

Saturday April 27

Lying at Anchor in Dominica Employed in Storing on Board Wood and Fruit at Night Anchor Watch
Sailed the Day the Bark Peru went to Port of Day at 10 P.M. the Bark Star Boom came in and Anchored at Night Anchor Watch

Sunday April 28th

Lying at Anchor in Dominica the crew on Shore all but the Anchor Watch Wm H. Collins and George Adams both landed while on Shore.

Monday April 29th

Lying at Anchor in Dominica Employed in getting Water at 3 P.M. took our anchor and stood out to Sea the Wind from E Stowing N.V.W. in Company with the Brig D. B. Small at 11 A.M. the Anchors and Chains at 7 P.M. the Island of Saddle Peak. Being 11 to 12 Miles distant. Shipd one Man to go with us Henry Johnson by name
