

Remarks on Board Bark Bertha of New Bedford
Thursday April 30th

This Day Commenced with a calm lying under the lee of Sand Island at 10 AM a light breeze from the South-west steering N W in company with the Brig D C Small at 9 AM Gen. Montserrat - one of the West India Island at 6 PM the Town of Plymouth on the Island of Montserrat bearing N E 1/2 N Miles distant - a fresh breeze from N E steering W at 12 past 6 PM passed the Cape Sables Light and rounded the West Point.

Wednesday May 1st

This Day Commenced with a light breeze from N E at 1 AM leaving aback of St. Kitts Island at 5 AM a breeze freshened and soon drove the vessel at 8 AM Captain Robinson and wife went on shore the Bark leaving off and on at 3 PM Captain Robinson came for Board kept off steering W by N. Shipped four Men on shore and took them on Board at 6 PM Sandy Point of St. Kitts Island bearing N N W 8 Miles distant. The Men names are William Henry, John A. Richardson, William Richards, Will Mallett.

Remarks on Board Bark Bertha of New Bedford
Thursday May 2nd

This Day Commenced with a fine breeze from E at day light - saw the Island of St. Vincent and the Bark Penn of New Bedford at anchor some 12 miles off. What else in a short time the Bark for her outfit - success. Painted the anchor black took the windless apart and cleaned it and painted it - Red at 12 past 6 PM Day Island bearing N N E 7 Miles distant.

Friday May 3rd

This Day Commenced with a fine breeze from E N E steering by the wind heading N employed in painting the Green Work aloft. Gen. A. Steamer steering to the Eastward also in this steering to the N W.

Saturday May 4th

This Day Commenced with a fine breeze from E N E steering by the wind heading N saw three Ships painted the Starboard Boat.

Latitude 20-58 N Long 65-37 W

Sunday May 5th

This Day Commenced with a fine breeze from E steering by the wind heading N N E two Ships in sight.
