This Day Commences with a fresh breeze from E at 5 A.M. sent in the Wake at 8 A.M. Henry Johnson Died at 11 A.M. Buried him at Sea Employed in Boiling and Stowing Down Oil two Sail in Light at 5 P.M. a strong breeze with rain squalls under Single reefed top Sails and Fore Sail

Friday Aug 16th

This Day Commences with a strong breeze from E the Wind Employed in Boiling three Sails in Light - Thomas Hatch off Duty with a Sea food the Cooper and Carpenter Sailed

This Day Commences with a fresh breeze from E consisting under Single reefed top Sails one Sail in Light - Employed in Washing Stiff inside

This Day Commences with a light air from the E. E. wind coming under Single reef top Sails three Sails in Light - the Cooper Sailed Thomas Hatch off Duty with a Boil on his leg the weather Pleasant and very warm
