Remarks on Board Bark Bertha of New Bedford Mass. 1848
Tuesday Sept. 6th

This Day Commenced with a fine breeze from S E
blowing by the wind with all sail set heading
N E by E. saw a Bark. Putting to the N W. Mr.
Walcott Employed in putting out for dinner
at 1 P M. F. W. Hassall's Raised Spear
Whale. Landed the Boat - Mr. Lichen & Thora
killed and took the Whale along - Mr. made
all stow and lashed by the Whale

Friday Sept. 7th

This Day Commenced with a light breeze from the
Eastward at 3 A M. Commenced cutting. Cut in
the Body and Lashed by the Head. and Commenced
Boiling

Saturday Sept. 8th

This Day Commenced with a fine breeze from S E
here on the Head and killed the Cow at 5 P M.
A heavy breeze with rain Squalls. Employed in
Boiling
