

Remarks on Board Bark Beatha off New Bedford
Thursday Oct. 15th

This day opens with a strong breeze from N.W. Steering by it under short sail at 12 o'clock kept off for the harbor. Delivered the boat & three mate took a crew and went in at half past nine o'clock. Boat came off and brought some beefs & 13 chickens. Took the boat up. Capt. & Family came off in a shore boat about the same time kept off. At 6 P.M. made all sail about 2 o'clock saw a steamer steering to the Westward. Albert Johnson & Antone Dias off duty. Light bearing N.E. To E ends this day.

Friday Oct. 16th
Strong breeze from N.W. Steering N.E. Watch employed in making out wires & the light. At about dusk walking with provisions in sight. Saw 2 men off Duty. Lattes part. Wind N.E. To E ends this day.

Saturday Oct. 17th
This day opens with strong breeze from N.W. Steering N.E. Watch employed in ships duty saw one steamer going N.E. & 3 sailing vessels, saw 2 men off Duty sick. Lat. 34-20 Lon. 23-10 To E ends this day.

Sunday Oct. 18th
This day opens with a strong breeze from N.W. Steering N.E. at 12 o'clock saw 2 sail going to the S.W. Lattes part steering N.E. & E saw 2 men off Duty. Albert Johnson & Antone Dias. Lat. 32-00 N Lon. 31-00 W To E ends this day.

Robinson Master Bernard Lee Bearcliffe
Monday Oct. 21st

This day opens with a good breeze from N.W. Steering N.E. & E. Watch employed ships duty one sail in sight with 3 lattes. Light same 2 men off Duty.

Tue 30-22 N Lon 19-15 To E ends this day
Tuesday Oct. 22nd

This day opens with a light breeze from the N. Steering N.E. & E. at about noon sail the island off Palmar at a point one saw Bearcliffe watch employed in ships duty saw 3 sails. One man still sick at 2 o'clock light bearing N.E. Light ship heading N.E.

Lat. 28-10 N Lon. 20-00 W To E ends.

Wednesday Oct. 23rd
This day opens with a light breeze from the N.E. Laying off on the island about 3 o'clock let go anchor & pulled sails saw 2 men off Duty. To E ends this day.

Thursday Oct. 24th
This day opens with fine weather all hands employed in raising the rigging & painting head chains one man for the mast. Had three more planing boards for the deck saw 2 men off Duty sick. To E ends this day.

Friday Oct. 25th
This day opens with laying at anchor all hands employed in ships duty. At noon 2 P.M. going @ was observed saw a sperm whale about 4 miles off. Lattes the harbor boat but did not get within a mile off him. came on board at dusk.
