

Remarks on Board Bark Boston off New Bedford
Saturday Oct. 26th

This day opens with laying at anchor at about 9 o'clock forenoon. The boats were sent to look for whales. The second mate & third did not get on too there came on board & took the boats up about 4 past 3 o'clock all hands employed in ship's duty. Mr. Penn. Agstone, Davis & Albert Johnson off Duty.

To End This Day
Sunday Oct. 27th

This day opens with laying at anchor at about 8 o'clock forenoon. The men went on shore in the second mate's boat & returned all came off at sunset. The 3 men off Duty. To Ends.

Monday Oct. 28th

This day opens with laying at anchor all hands employed in ship's duty. Three men off Duty. Took about 80 bbls of Water. To Ends This Day.

Tuesday Oct. 29th

This day opens with laying at anchor all hands employed in ship's duty. Had 6 sacks of Potatoes came off & the packs that had black fish oil in it same men off Duty. To Ends This Day.

Wednesday Oct. 30th

This day opens with laying at anchor all hands employed in taking water and showing off the hole after. Second mate & boats crew went on shore came off at 3 o'clock same men off Duty. To Ends.

Robinson Master Laying at anchor at Veneriffe
Thursday Oct. 31st

This day opens with laying at anchor all hands employed in stowing off the hole and took on board about 220 bbls of Water at daylight Albert Johnson was missing he was showed away in the boat that went in last evening & expect that Mrs. Penn & Antonio Dias off Duty. Sick.

To Ends This Day
Friday Nov. 1st

This day opens with laying at anchor all hands employed in getting ready for sea at about 10 o'clock took the anchor wind light soon after it was calm lowered all boats & towed about an hour took the boats up 3 more off Duty sick same as George Adams latter part light breeze from North. To Ends This Day.

Saturday Nov. 2nd

This day opens with a light breeze from the N. Steering North. Mid part calm. Watch employed in ship's duty 2 men off Duty. Antonio Dias & George Adams Sick. A dark was between the 2 islands. Veneriffe bearing North & S. S. South. N. 1st latter part light wind from NW. West 2 sails in sight.
