Wednesday June 22nd

This day opens with a good breeze from the Eastward
steering South by W. most of the day saw one sail & grasspuss
watch employed in repairing the ship.

Lat 35-10 North Long 45-40 W. To land this day
Thursday June 23rd

This day opens with a good wind from N. E. steering
South westerly at work on the job about 9 o'clock A.M.
saw a sail it kept off for an spoke him it was the
Charles W. Morgan off New Bedford & Miss Master
& months out 1200 lbs Sperm oil Capt. came on board
about 11 o'clock left about dark at sunset took in sail
and kept by the wind on St. Paul heading N. N. E.
Lat 37-19 North Long 50-45 West

Two merchantmen went along side off and
off then took some better she was from Buenos Ayres
bound for Barbados name Josephine Photo

Friday June 24th

This day opens with a good wind from N. E. steering
by it on the St. Paul at daylight thick & raining at about
1 o'clock stopped raining but thick all day

Saturday June 25th

This day opens with a good breeze from N. E. steering
by it on the St. Paul heading N. E. at 1 o'clock made all sail
it went about on the St. Paul at sunset took in light
sails & crested topsails wind increasing at 11 P.M. took in
fore topsails & were ship thick & raining

Lat 38-20 North Long 50 To land this day
Sunday June 26th

This day opens with a strong wind from N. E. steering
by it on the St. Paul at daylight off sail at 9 o'clock A.M.
took in foresail & closed reefed main topsail at 2 P.M.
weather better lowered foresail nothing in sight

Lat 38-45 North Long 45-15 West To land this day
Monday June 27th

This day opens with a strong wind from N. E. steering
by it on the St. Paul at daylight about 1 o'clock A.M. wind freshened
too the N. E. at sunrise took the reefs out of the topsails
& kept off N. E. by 6 at one corner too take in sail
& came too the wind it blowing half a gale

Lat 38-20 North Long 47-30 W. To land this day
Tuesday June 28th

This day opens with a strong wind N. N. W. steering
by it on the St. Paul at daylight weather better saw a sail called
it a whaler made all sail at about 1 o'clock spoke her it
was the Bark Wave. Harmon Master Capt. came
on board about 11 o'clock took light sails wind increasing
about sunset kept went on board his bark then it was
blowing strong Lat 38-20 Long 45-10 W. To land this day
