

Remarks On Board Bark Beatha off New Bedford
Wednesday Jan 25th

This day opens with a gale from the West laying her under
close reefed main topsail, fore sail & storm sails about 9
o'clock a.m. while taking in fore sail split it soon
after grooved winged main topsail one man too the
mast head saw two birds during the day sunset some around
Lat 39 31 17 South Long 49 16 West & hoisted main topsail

He ends this day

Thursday Jan 26th

This day opens with a gale from the West, laying her
under short sail on the Port tack heading from N. to
N. W. at 2 o'clock a.m. grooved winged main topsail
at 8 o'clock it again & closed fore topsail close reefed
mid part wind hauled N. W.

Lat 37 49 Long 47 56 West He ends this day

Friday Jan 31st

This day opens with a strong breeze from the West N. W.
steering by it at day light commenced to moderate went
on Port tack & made all sail latter part wind light from
the North steering N. W. by W. watch employed in ship's
Duty nothing in sight Lat 39 14 Long 40 14 He ends

Saturday Feb 1st

This day opens with a nice breeze from North steering
N. W. by West with all sail out watch employed in
breaking out water, broke out a new foresail sent the
old one down & sent up the new one nothing in sight
Lat 39 39 N Long 48 20 West

He ends this day

Robinson Master, Cruising off River Rio Delapilata
Thursday Feb 2nd

This day opens with a good breeze from the N. W. West
steering N. W. with all sail out at 2 P. M. came too
the wind on the Port board tack heading about N. by N.
at sunset took in sail at 1 o'clock were around
Lat 37 43 South Long 51 07 W. He ends this day

Monday Feb 3rd

This day opens with a light wind from the North
steering by the Port tack at day light made all sail
Capit went down in the White boat with 3 men and
scraped the clars off the ship finished and took the
boat up about 7 o'clock then went at work on the fore sail
nothing but porpoises & garpusses in sight at sunset
shortened sail watch employed in repairing foresail
Lat 38 25 Long 51 34 He ends this day

Tuesday Feb 4th

This day opens with a good wind from the N. E.
steering to the W. watch at work on the foresail
at sunset shortened sail nothing in sight latter part
squally Lat 37 22 Long 50 36 He ends this day

Wednesday Feb 5th

This day opens with a strong wind from N. W. steering
by it on the Port tack at half past twelve o'clock a.m.
had a heavy squall from the North called all hands
& took in all sail but main & fore & fore topsail
stay sail & took up the boat saw the Bark Wave
& garmaned with her at sunrise made some sail
but took it in before night & being squally all day
