Monday May 12th

Laying at anchor at Barbadoes at daylight called all hands
went to work washing ship and sides in a cleaning
iron work steel anchor & the ends this day

Tuesday May 13th

This day opens with Laying at anchor called all hands
went to work setting up the head strops & secured down
the fore & main yards & put some pieces of boards under
the barrels sent them up again some employed in
hauling down head strops & other rigging Wash of Duty
on shore at twelve had anchor watch No ends this day

Wednesday May 14th

Laying at anchor at daylight called all hands went
to work painting & on rigging the sails Wash of Duty
3 bbls of Sugar carried. No ends this day

Thursday May 15th

Laying at anchor all hands employed in painting spars
& ship & repaired the huts on the topsail yards Wash of Duty
Watch went on shore after dinner No ends this day

Friday May 16th

Laying at anchor at sunrise all on Board except one man
Charles Williams all hands employed in painting
Wash of Duty on shore most of the time No ends this day

Saturday May 17th

Laying at anchor all on Board except Charles Williams
all Charles employed in ship's duty
No ends this day

Robinson's Master. Laying at anchor at Barbadoes
Sunday May 18th

Laying at anchor at daylight washed of the deck then the watch
went on shore on sentry Charles Williams still missing
No ends this day

Monday May 19th

Laying at anchor at 7 o'clock all on board except the Unworks
& Henry Sackett the Cook Frank Jones & Charles Williams &
one man that was sent on the articles sent the 1st watch on
shore & they berthing sails No ends this day

Tuesday May 20th

Laying at anchor Watch all on Board at 7 o'clock all the watch
then went on shore Watch employed in getting ready for
Sea took on Board 5 bbls of flour one bbl of peas & 200 Gallons
of Molasses Walter Handy Steward & Isaac Wash Cook

Wednesday May 21th

Laying at anchor at 2 o'clock all on Board except
except Henry Sackett & three others & men they all 3 belonged
to the Unworks at 4 o'clock the Capt came on Board
took the anchor went out to Sea had 3 new men on
Board made all sail & kept the W by N. Barks Perry
& Ashby in company with us had a good breeze from
Southwest No ends this day

Thursday May 22nd

This day opens with a light breeze from the South
the evening Mr N. W. saw the Island of Montserrat
about 2 o'clock & Mr saw Dominica & the Unworks at
sunset the Unworks sailed & carried the wind with main
yard aback & commenced with these 2 Barks till 9 o'clock
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
