

Remarks on Board Bark Bertha of New Bedford
Monday June 2^d

This day opens with a light breeze from the Southwest at daylight. The Island of Soudahe about 12 miles bearing N. N. W. Course N. W. by W. & W. S. W. in sight one of them the Bark being he came out in company with us at sunset the South point of Soudahe bearing N. N. E. and one more island in sight spoke the Perry Capt. Nickerson came on board spoke a short time then kept off again on the same course for St. Kitts Joseph the one of the Boat Steers of Duty ends this day.

Tuesday June 3^d

This day opens with light variable winds & squally at about 7 o'clock it came in thick & raining at about 1 o'clock it cleared of sun the Islands of Nevis & St. Vincent at 3 o'clock saw the Island of Nevis at sunset took in light sails kept on the Course N. W. by N. & N. till 5 o'clock then headed off those with main yard aback the Island of St. Kitts 12 miles of bearing N. N. W. Joseph one of the Boat Steers of Duty ends this day.

Wednesday June 4th

This day opens with a light wind from the Eastward, laying off on the Island of St. Kitts at 7 o'clock when the Town about 2 miles of lowland Water boat Capt. went on shore sent back took her up at 1 o'clock at half past ten o'clock at 11 sent her in again at half past 11 Capt. came up with 6 more men & one Boy made all sail & kept of N. W. by N. passed the Town of St. Kitts at 6 o'clock & on at sunset the Island of Nevis bearing W. several sails in sight Course N. W. by N. & the wind light Joseph still sick. So ends this day.

Robinson Master Command on the Western General Cruising
Sat. 11th 1805 at 11 O'clock June 5th

This day opens with a light breeze from N. E. at daylight saw the Island of Soudahe bearing S. by E. headed the goods & came to the Wind heading N. E. & N. & several sails in sight watch employed in ships Duty Joseph on Duty Boat Steers took the watches. So ends this day.

Friday June 6th

This day opens with a light breeze from N. E. & steering by it on the S. tack heading North most of the time latter part N. E. & watch employed in ships Duty Joseph on Duty Boat Steers took the watches. So ends this day.

Saturday June 7th

This day opens with a calm about 10 o'clock at 11 head a light breeze from the S. E. & steering by it with all sail out on the S. tack heading N. E. & watch washing clothes. No sights. So ends this day.

Sunday June 8th

This day opens with light wind from N. E. to S. W. till 3 o'clock when the wind had a calm till about sunset when head light breeze from N. E. & steering by it on the S. tack heading North about 3 o'clock head E. & squally took in light sails & reefed top sails plenty of thunder & lightning & good strong breeze latter part at 10 o'clock made all sail wind lighter. So ends this day.
