

Remarks On Board Bark Bertha of New Bedford
Monday July 30th

This day opens with a good breeze from N.W. Steering by it on the Port tack. At 12 o'clock we were around headed N.W. at sunrise made sail & kept off N.W. at 2 o'clock & we came to the wind heading N.W. & sails going about S. & watch employed in ships duty sunset took in sail
Lat. 33-35 N Long 64-21 W at 12 o'clock we ended this day

Tuesday July 31st

This day opens with a N.W. breeze Steering by it on the Port tack heading N.W. at about 6 o'clock it became in clouds & raining variable winds till about 6 o'clock & then it cleared & a fresh breeze came from N.W. with a strong breeze at 12 o'clock we were around heading N.W. but for a while in sight sunset took in sail & anchor no lights. So ends this day

Wednesday July 2nd

This day opens with a good breeze from N.W. Steering by it on the Port tack under short sail at sunrise made sail and kept on the same tack heading East nothing in sight watch employed in ships duty sunset shortened sail
Lat. 33-10 N Long 64-00 West So ends this day

Thursday July 3rd

This day opens with a light breeze from the Eastward Steering by it on the Port tack at sunrise made sail at 10 o'clock we were around headed N.W. by 6 o'clock employed in ships duty & sails in sight sunset shortened sail
Lat. 33-02 N Long 63-30 West So ends this day

Robinson Master. Cruising

Friday July 4th

This day opens with a light breeze from the Eastward Steering by it on the Port tack daylight made sail watch employed in washing clothes one Steamer & 4 vessels in sight
12 o'clock went around sunset shortened sail. No lights

Saturday July 5th

This day opens with light variable wind till 9 o'clock we were then had a good breeze from N.W. Steering by it heading N.W. watch employed in washing ship inside sunrise made sail nothing in sight of state shortened sail at sunset
Lat. 33-55 N Long 64-12 West So ends this day

Sunday July 6th

This day opens with a light breeze from N.W. at 6 o'clock we were around and made sail heading from S.E. to S.W. by W. & sails in sight at 5 o'clock on Port tack in light sail & being equally sunset reefed topsails at 10 & we were around on the Port tack heading N.W.

Lat. 33-06 North Long 64-30 W So ends this day

Monday July 7th

This day opens with equally lighter at 3 o'clock we went around on the Port tack continued Squalls raining till about 10 o'clock the wind came to the N.W. made all sails kept by it on the Port tack heading N.W. till 5 o'clock then came up to W. watch employed in ships duty one Steamer & one sailing vessel in sight

Lat. 32 12 N Long 63-32 West So ends this day
