

Remains on board Bark Brother of New Bedford
Shed along on the St. Jack heading W N W about 3 o'clock
Whaling Brig Spake & joined with him it was the Clifford
Engle Master about 1 o'clock he went on board shortened sail as usual
Lat 31-22 N. Long 48-07 W So ends this day
Thursday August 14

This day opens with a good breeze from the N. E. steering by it
at the St. Jack at one o'clock we went around at sunrise
made sail 3 sails same two & a Merchant Brig watch
employed in stowing down all Sunset shortened sail
Lat 31-32 Long 49-14 W So ends this day
Friday August 15

This day opens with a light breeze from the N. E. steering
by it on the St. Jack heading N N W made sail at sunrise
Watch employed in ship's duty nothing in sight but
the Clifford & a Steamer at 2 o'clock & we were aroused on
the St. Jack heading N E
Lat 31-53 N Long 48-14 W So ends this day
Saturday August 16

This day opens with a light breeze from the North steering
by it at sunrise made sail & kept off watch employed in
Ship's Duty nothing but porpoises in sight Sunset
shortened sail & came to the wind on the St. Jack
Lat 31-21 North Long 48-48 West So ends this day

Rebiscare Master. Cruising off the Western Shore
Sunday August 17

This day opens with light variable winds & squally
Weather at daylight was around in the St. Jack heading
N E & shortened sail about 3 o'clock wind hauled to
the East then went on the St. Jack heading N E
nothing in sight Sunset shortened sail George Adams of Duty
Vick Lat 31-36 N Long 48-53 W So ends this day
Monday August 18

This day opens with a light breeze from N E steering by it
on the St. Jack heading N E & sunrise made sail & kept off
N E Watch employed in breaking out provisions & then
sight at noon on the fore rigging setting it up nothing in
sight but porpoises Sunset shortened sail George Adams of Duty
Lat 31-44 N Long 48-00 W So ends this day
Tuesday August 19

This day opens with a calm & dead the same did not make
sail Watch employed in setting up the main rigging
nothing in sight George Adams still of Duty & a Portuguese
by the name of Shakespeare 31-56 N Long 48-21 W
Wednesday August 20

This day opens with a light breeze from the Westward
steering by it till sunrise then made sail & kept off
at about 2 o'clock P M shortened sail by the watch employed
in Ship's Duty nothing of note in sight Sunset shortened sail
the same 2 men of Duty
Lat 32-16 N Long 47-52 W So ends this day
