at sunrise made sail & kept it N. E. about 1 o'clock a N. W. Sea
black fish lowered all these boats but did not get a chance
to strike came along side about 1 o'clock. watch employed in
ships duty saw four sails merchantman's sunset shortened
sail & came to the wind on the Star tack with main yard
black Whakespore of Duty. Lat. 32-23 N. Long 47-01 W. So ends

Friday Aug. 22nd

This day opens with a light breeze from the West steering by
it on the Star tack on N. W. at sunrise made sail & kept
it N. E. & saw nothing but frigates at sunset shortened
sail & came to the wind on the Star tack Whakespore of Duty
Lat. 32-22 N. Long 46-00 W. So ends this day

Saturday Aug. 23rd

This day opens with a light breeze from N. W. steering by it
on the Star tack at one o'clock were around at sunrise made
sail & kept off N. E. & watch employed in washing these
clothes nothing in sight all hands on Duty sunset shortened
Lat. 32-10 North So ends this day

Sunday Aug. 24th

This day opens with a calm about 2 o'clock the
man on the lookout heard a Saw Ocean Whales
called all hands but about the same time they started
to sail it is quick at daylight saw nothing had a calm
till about 10 o'clock then had a light breeze from N. E.
made sail & worked to the N. E. saw a merchant bark
Lat. 32-07 N. Long 45-12 W. sunset shortened sail

Robinson Master Cruising on the Western Bruner
Monday Aug. 25th

This day opens with a light breeze from the S. E. & at daylight
were around on the Star tack heading N. E. & made all sail saw
a Whaling Brig the spoke us it was the Steamer Barstow
Wood Webster. Capt. & Wife came on board about 10 o'clock in the
evening the day went on board about 6 o'clock sunset shortened sail
Lat. 32-22 N. Long 47-07 West So ends this day

Tuesday Aug. 26th

This day commences with a light wind from S. E. & steering by
it on the Star tack heading N. W. at sunrise made sail watch employed
in ships duty nothing in sight but the Brig. sunset shortened sail

Lat. 32-27 N. Long 49-57 W. So ends this day

Wednesday Aug. 27th

This day opens with a light breeze from S. E. steering by it on
the Star tack saw a merchant vessel going to the N. W. about
2 o'clock in the afternoon made sail watch employed in ships
duty saw the Schooner Edward Lee Atkins Master
Barstow with him sunset shortened sail

Lat. 32-57 N. Long 49-50 W. So ends this day

Thursday Aug. 28th

This day opens with a light breeze from the South steering
by it at sunrise made sail the schooner close to and
Capt. Atkins came on board saw the Brig and blackfish
shortened sail as well and kept on the Star tack heading
to the Eastward

Lat. 32-04 N. Long 49-57 West So ends this day
