

Remarks On Board Bark *Beothic* of New Bedford
Thursday Sept. 11th

This day opens with a good breeze from the N. N. E. Steering by it on the Starboard Tack. Sunrise made all sail watch employed in Ship's Duty. Schooner & a vessel in sight. Sunset Shortened Sail. Byron of Duty Lat. 35° 54' North Long 33° 47' W. So ends this day.

Friday Sept. 12th

This day opens with a strong breeze from the North Steering by it on the Starboard Tack heading N. E. at sunrise made sail. Watch employed in Ship's Duty. Byron still sick. Nothing in sight. Sunset Shortened Sail it being Squally. Lat. 37° 27' N. Long 31° 36' W. So ends this day.

Saturday Sept. 13th

This day opens with a strong breeze from the N. E. Steering by it on the Starboard Tack heading from S. E. to S. at 6 o'clock went around heading N. by W. & made some sail it being Squally watch employed in Ship's duty. Nothing in sight of land. At 5 o'clock I went on the Starboard Tack heading S. E. Byron of Duty Lat. 37° 56' N. Long 31° 22' W. So ends

Sunday Sept. 14th

This day opens with a light breeze from N. E. Steering by it on the Starboard Tack heading about S. E. with all sail set. Sunrise made short sail Steering N. W. at 4 o'clock went on the Starboard Tack. Byron on Duty.

Lat. 37° 22' N. Long 29° 33' W. So ends this day.

Robinson Master. Cruising around the Islands
Monday Sept. 15th

This day opens with a good breeze from N. E. Steering by it on the Starboard Tack with all sail set at 4 o'clock went about and Starboard Tack heading S. E. saw the Island of S. E. at 10 o'clock. At 11 saw Gorgal watch employed in Ship's Duty. At sunset took in main sail & fore top gallant sail. Gorgal bearing N. E. by N. S. E. by E. Lat. 38° 00' So ends this day.

Tuesday Sept. 16th

This day opens with a strong breeze from the N. E. Steering by it on the Starboard Tack heading S. E. side of the Island of Gorgal. Saw 3 sails watch employed in Ship's Duty. Latter part wind light. So ends this day.

Wednesday Sept. 17th

This day opens with a light breeze from N. N. W. at 6 o'clock made sail and kept it for the passage of Gorgal. At 11 o'clock at the lower end the Starboard Tack kept opening wind on shore boat came off about 4 o'clock & brought some fruit and a shore boat brought of some potatoes, onions & a quarter of Beef. Boat left and went on shore took the Ship's Boat up and ahead of shore. So ends this day.

Thursday Sept. 18th

This day opens with a strong breeze and heavy squalls. Steered N. E. Steering by it working up to the harbor at 12 o'clock lowered Starboard Tack. Second mate and crew went on shore. Came back about 4 o'clock. Mr. Walter Denby stayed on shore. Boat brought of 2 days fowls. Took her up and ahead of shore. So ends this day.
