saw the land Coast of Africa kept for it until it was
about 15 miles off then kept along the Coast heading N. by E.
to the North Bay on Duty Charles in room in the house
Sea 11-30 P. Long 11-24 E. So ends this day
Sunday Feb. 22nd

This day opens with a light breeze from the S. by W.
steering along the land heading about S. by E. with all sailing
sail at 1 o'clock went at work getting up the cables
and anchors of the boat ready to make it sunset took
in light sails and came to the wind with main just
aback on the Western Tack at 10 o'clock the boat along by
the wind Charles in room the Briggs still below
