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Remarks On Board Bark Boston of Office Bedford
Sunday - Feb 29th

This day opens with laying at anchor and Boat on shore
at daylight after Burgess. After Breakfast he went back and
nearly all hands went in. They was all on Board by 10 o'clock.

Monday March 1st

This day opens with laying at anchor at daylight went to getting
out casks for a raft sent it on shore about 9 o'clock. When finished
hauling the inside Mr. Burgess and Boats crew filling the casks
Tore them on deck about 4 o'clock. In the evening
nearly all hands went on shore came off at 10 o'clock.

On Ends this day

Tuesday March 2nd

This day opens with laying at anchor called all
hands at daylight all hands employed in drawing down water
went about 6 o'clock off casks on shore at 1 o'clock when they on board
about 4 o'clock. In and run it below and put the boat on
the House after supper Kofi & Wifoa were off on shore
and Miss Briggs & Burgess and another were ill. But Miss Burgess
came off about 10 o'clock.

On Ends this day

Wednesday March 3rd

This day opens with laying at anchor all employed in getting
water and getting ready for sea in the evening Kofi & Wifoa
and Burgess went on shore all came off about 10 o'clock. Boats put
some Kofi and Wifoa on shore. On Ends this day

Thursday March 4th

Friday March 5th

This day opens with laying at anchor at daylight called all
hands at 10 o'clock after Burgess took them on Board and
have up the anchor about 1 o'clock. In and went to see if boat out
by the wind on the port tack heading N.W. Mr. Burgess went in
with the Boat to land the customs & police officer at 7 o'clock took in
the gallant sails took the Boat up about 5 o'clock. So ends

Friday March 5th

This day opens with a calm about 1 o'clock on the harbor breeze
from N.W. W. steering by it on the port tack heading N.W.
at half past one o'clock. In John one of the Boats Steers. Saw
lowered the ^{Whales} Burgess & the Martin about 2 o'clock and then
Mr. Briggs lowered the Steward went in the head of the
Boat. The Martin went on and struck one and killed
him. The line parted and he side Mr. Briggs went on and
struck but the men did not go through the blubber and came out
chased until sunset without success came along side at dark
Whales going to the take up the Boats and shortened
Bail and kept on the Western tack to begin this day.

Saturday March 6th

This day opens with a light breeze from the N.W. steering by it
on the Western tack at daylight made sail and kept off to the
Northward. Saw plenty of porpoises and squid and one pod of
grampuses at sunset went about heading about S. & saw land in
the forenoon. Water employed in washing clothes at sunset
shortened sail.
