

Spencer's On Board Bark Brothers of New Bedford.

Monday April 2nd

This day opens with laying at anchor all but 4 of the crew on board. They came off at 10 o'clock AM. There the ones that was ashore Friday evening went in again. So ends this day.

Tuesday April 3rd

This day opens with laying at anchor called all hands at daylight and found 3 of the crew was missing. Portuguese that shipped in before. Those that went on shore all came off. Sent a boat to the bark Mary Rogers and took a piece of cloth and 7 lbs of flour after that went to bark Deane and took a boat load of wood and one cask of Saw line from bark boat. Scowder boat went to pier and brought 6 sacks of potatoes and 2 barrels and kegs and crates and exchanged at board with Philip Eliza Adams. Received on board 7 dry bars of meat & fish at 7 o'clock PM. Took the anchors and went to see George Adams and those three men missing. So ends this day.

Wednesday April 4th

This day opens with a light breeze from S. Steaming by it coming of the Island. Making in sight the Island and spars of bark. Sent a boat to the Island bearing 10 lbs of flour. So ends this day.

Wednesday April 7th

This day opens with a light breeze from the South. Steaming by it on the 10 o'clock heading to N. W. At one o'clock were ordered and stood in shore at daylight made all sail. Saw a Whaler standing off shore and a merchant bark going in at anchor. At 4 o'clock lowered the back and secured. Mule and crew went in to the pier came off about 4 o'clock and brought back 2 of the men. That left Sunday night took up the boat and stood off shore. Sent a boat to the pier.

Thursday April 8th

This day opens with a good breeze at 2 o'clock AM were ordered standing in shore at 10 o'clock sent the Burgess and a crew in after the Capt. & family they came off about 1 o'clock took the boat up and went off shore and made sail heading to by the George Adams and the Portuguese missing. So ends this day.

Friday April 9th

This day opens with a good breeze from S. Steaming by it on the 10 o'clock heading to N. W. At daylight saw a sail and they came towards us. Saw a bark and came on board. It was Capt. Allen of bark Grayhound 11 months out 190 lbs. Spent all day and night sent back with him and the mate came here gave up gunning about 7 o'clock the Island in sight bearing S. W. at 8 o'clock were ordered and stood to the Eastward.

Sat. 15th 17 South. So ends this day.
