 This day opens Saturday April 24th
 This day opens with a good breeze from the S.W. Steering
 by it on the S. tack heading S.W. about 11 o'clock saw

 came alongside took up the Boat & repaired her and lowered
 and Starboard & Starboard Boats chased untill about 3 o'clock
 then Starboard to the Ship came alongside about 7 o'clock
 Capt. took the third Whales whale alongside and had him
 cut in by 3 o'clock. Watch employed in clearing up the deck
 and took in light sails

 1st boat at daylight and at 1 o'clock were around on the
 Port tack nothing in sight

 sailing about 2 o'clock at 11. At 11 the 1st boat on
 Port tack came and that came from Eliza Adams
 Lat. 41-09-09 S Long. 71-17 W. So ends this day
Tuesday April 27th
 This day opens with a light breeze from the S.W. Steering
 by it on the S. tack. Watch employed in breaking out
 water and stowed down the oil nothing in sight at sunset
 took in light sails
 Lat. 41-09-35 S Long. 71-15 W. So ends this day
Wednesday April 28th
 This day opens with a light breeze from the South Steering
 by it on the S. tack heading S.W. at 1 o'clock went
 around and made all sail watch employed in Ship's
 duty nothing but small fish in sight at sunset
 took in light sails
 Lat. 41-09-34 S Long. 71-50 W. So ends this day
Thursday April 29th
 This day opens with a light breeze from the S.W. Steering
 by it on the S. tack at sunset made all sail at 1 o'clock
 to the wind around Watch employed in Ship's duty
 lowered the Waite Boat and caught a turtle
 Lat. 41-09-34 S Long. So ends this day
