Thursday May 12th

This day opens with a light breeze from the S. S. W.
Steering by it on the S. Tack heading S. E. at sunrise
made sail and at 1 o'clock kept off to by S. Watch finished
the spars and laid it nothing but foresails in sight
at sunset shortened sail
Lat. 12-40 S. Long. 23-23 S. So. S. S. S. this day

Friday May 14th

This day opens with a light breeze from W. S. W. Steering
by it on the S. Tack heading S. E. at sunrise made sail
and kept off to the North Watch employed in breaking out
foresails & Water Tack in the fore stay sail and head
therefore top mast stay sail at sunset shortened sail and
came to the wind on the S. Tack heading S. E.
Lat. 12-20 S. Long. 20-20 S. So. S. S. S. this day

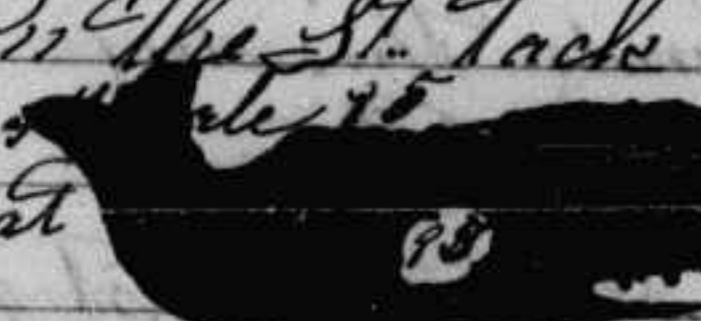
Saturday May 15th

This day opens with a light breeze from the S. W.
Steering by it on the S. Tack heading S. E. at sunrise
made sail and kept off to at 1 o'clock & we kept
W. S. W. Watch wearing clothes at sunset shortened
sail and came to the wind on the S. Tack
heading W. S. W. Lat. 11-33 S. So. S. S. S. this day

Sunday May 16th

This day opens with a strong breeze from the S. S. W. Steering
by it on the S. Tack at sunrise lowered fore & spars
Saw 2 Whales 1 spoke and gunnisoned with one of them
the Mary Croaker the other one was the long haired
at sunset reefed topsails Capt. Dexter went on board
about 1 o'clock Lat. 11-20 S. Long. 20-10 W. So. S. S. S. this day

Monday May 17th

This day opens with a strong breeze from the S. S. W. Steering
by it on the S. Tack heading S. E. at sunrise took the
Whale boat  reefed the topsails and kept
off to at about 1 o'clock the sails
Saw a sperm whale lowered all 3 boats about 10
o'clock at 12 o'clock the watchman went on and started
Whale show the boat he gave the second mate his line
and came to the ship when the Capt. lowered in the
S. S. boat and started the whale then all 3 boats
worked on him killed and took him along side about
1 o'clock & we then all hands employed in getting ready
to cut him in saw all hands below at 1 o'clock but one man
