Thursday June 3<sup>rd</sup>

This day opens with a light breeze from the S.W. Steering by it on the Starboard heading W by S at 7 o'clock loose the fore top gallant sail & gaff topsail. Watch employed in Ships Duty. Nothing in sight of mate

Lat. 29-30 S Long. 122-42 E So ends this day

Friday June 4<sup>th</sup>

This day opens with a light breeze from the S.W. Steering by it on the Starboard heading W by S with all sail out in Ships Duty. Nothing in sight at 5 o'clock I went around rigging S.E.

Lat. 29-47 S Long. 125-34 E So ends this day

Saturday June 5<sup>th</sup>

This day opens with a light breeze from the S.W. Steering by it on the Starboard heading S.E. at 7 o'clock I went about heading W by S watch employed in washing clothes. Nothing in sight of mate in sight

Lat. 29-52 S Long. 126-30 E So ends this day

Sunday June 6<sup>th</sup>

This day opens with a good breeze from the S.W. Steering by it making to the Southward. Nothing in sight at 9 o'clock I went around all the Starboard heading S.E. by S wind S.W.

Lat. 29-54 S Long. 128-44 E So ends this day

Monday June 7<sup>th</sup>

This day opens with a light breeze from the S.W. Steering by it on the Starboard heading S.E. Watch employed in Ships Duty. Nothing in sight of mate

Lat. 10-20 S Long. 127-40 E So ends this day

Tuesday June 8<sup>th</sup>

This day opens with a good breeze from the S.W. Steering by it on the Starboard heading S.W. with all sail out. Saw hump back & fin back whales, porpoises and porcupines

Lat. 10-20 S Long. 127-40 E So ends this day

Wednesday June 9<sup>th</sup>

This day opens with a good breeze from the S.W. Steering by it on the Starboard heading W with all sail out. At daylight saw a vessel putting in a whale were around and stood towards her. Captain & family went on board of her about 11 o'clock. Her name was the Greyhound. Captain & crew had one small whale they took the night before. Captain and wife came on board in the evening and were took in fore top gallant sail and kept by the wind on the Starboard heading but fin back in sight

Lat. 10-20 S Long. 126-35 E So ends this day

Thursday June 10<sup>th</sup>

This day opens with a good breeze from the south. Steering by it on the Starboard at 12 o'clock went around. Saw 2 seals and gannet with those in the evening. The Harbour Porpoise, and the Sec. Hound. Nothing more in sight sunset took in light sails

Lat. 11-25 S Long. 125-54 E So ends this day
