

Remarks for Board Back Bother off New Bedford
Sunday June 18th

This day opens with a light breeze from the S. Steering
by it on the eastern tack at sunrise made all sail
purposes mid & latter part of the day calm watch employed
in Ships Duty. Lat. 10-10 S Long. 23-30 E So ends this day

Monday June 19th

This day opens with a calm about noon the head &
light breeze from the South bore the main top gallant sail
and kept off N. N. E. watch employed in Ships Duty
at sunset took in light sails and came to the anchor
on the Eastern tack

Lat. 10-14 S Long. 23-25 E. So ends this day

Tuesday June 20th

This day opens with a light breeze from the S. Steering
by it on the Eastern tack at sunrise made all sail
Nothing in sight but purposes watch till sunset Shorten
Sail Lat. 10-15 S Long. 23-27 E So ends this day

Wednesday June 21st

This day opens with a light breeze from the S. W. Steering
by it on the S. W. tack at noon the wind veered on the
East tack and about sunrise veered back on the S. W. tack
and made sail. Day. Black fish and purposes watch
employed in washing Ship and side Sunset Shortened sail

Lat. 10-15 S Long. 23-27 E So ends this day

Thursday June 22nd

Friday June 23rd

This day opens with a light breeze from the W. Steering
by it on the S. W. tack at daylight made sail and kept on
Watch employed in breaking and water & provisions Nothing
in sight but purposes Sunset Shortened sail
Lat. 10-20 S Long. 23-54 E So ends this day

Saturday June 24th

This day opens with a light breeze from the S. W. Steering
by it at sunrise made all sail about 9 o'clock at the anchor
one hump back lowered the Mast and St. Boats put out
goat on and gave it up and came on Board about 11 o'clock
Watch employed in Ships Duty

Lat. 10-21 S Long. 24-02 E So ends this day

Sunday June 25th

This day opens with a good breeze from the S. W. Steering
by it at sunrise made all sail about 9 o'clock at the anchor
one hump back at sunset took in light sails but set them
again about 10 o'clock & the wind light

Lat. 10-24 S Long. 24-52 E So ends this day

Monday June 26th

This day opens with a light breeze from the S. W. Steering
by it at sunrise made all sail with watch employed in washing
& other. Saw the land at 1 o'clock & in at 4 o'clock &
cleared away the East anchor and put it in the shoe
and 20 fathoms of cable

So ends this day
