

Remarks On Board Bark Bradley of New Bedford

Saturday July 3rd

This day opens with lying at anchor at daylight lowered three boats but saw no Whales came along side about sunset Capt. took the anchors and went off shore about 3 miles anchored in 12 fathoms of water and put out 45 fathoms of chain

No birds this day

Sunday July 4th

This day opens with lying at anchor with 3 boats at daylight saw several Whales chased them but could not get on to them with the cars had it calm until about 3 o'clock & the Capt. went down in the St. Lawrence boat and chased one Whale saw three from the vessel but no chance boats came on board about 5 o'clock

No birds this day

Monday July 5th
This day opens with lying at anchor at daylight sent the 3 boats cruising at 12 o'clock the St. Lawrence came on board about sunset the other boats came back & Whales chased but could not get on to them

No birds this day

Tuesday July 6th
This day opens with lying at anchor at daylight the 3 boats went off came on board about dark did not see but one Whale and he was going quick had it calm until 2 o'clock & then there had a breeze from the W & W.

Wednesday July 7th

This day opens with lying at anchor three boats went off at daylight saw nothing came on board at sunset had a light breeze most of the day

No birds

Thursday July 8th
This day opens with lying at anchor at daylight sent two boats cruising saw 2 Whales had it calm and could not get on with the cars about one o'clock had a breeze from the S W second mate and boats crew stopped on board and helped get the ship under weigh and steered N W along the bar at dark anchored in 8 fathoms of water and about 25 fathoms of chain out

No birds

Friday July 9th
This day opens with lying at anchor at daylight sent two boats cruising third mate and crew stopped on board helped get the ship under weigh boats saw nothing until about five o'clock when the ship was hove to the ship saw a Whale lowered down the third mate and all three of the boats tried to get on to him but could not gave up and came on board about dark at sunset let go anchors about 3 miles S W of Sadron Point in 16 fathoms of water 20 fathoms of chain out Bark Warbler about 5 miles South anchored at dark saw some Steamer and one Schooner
