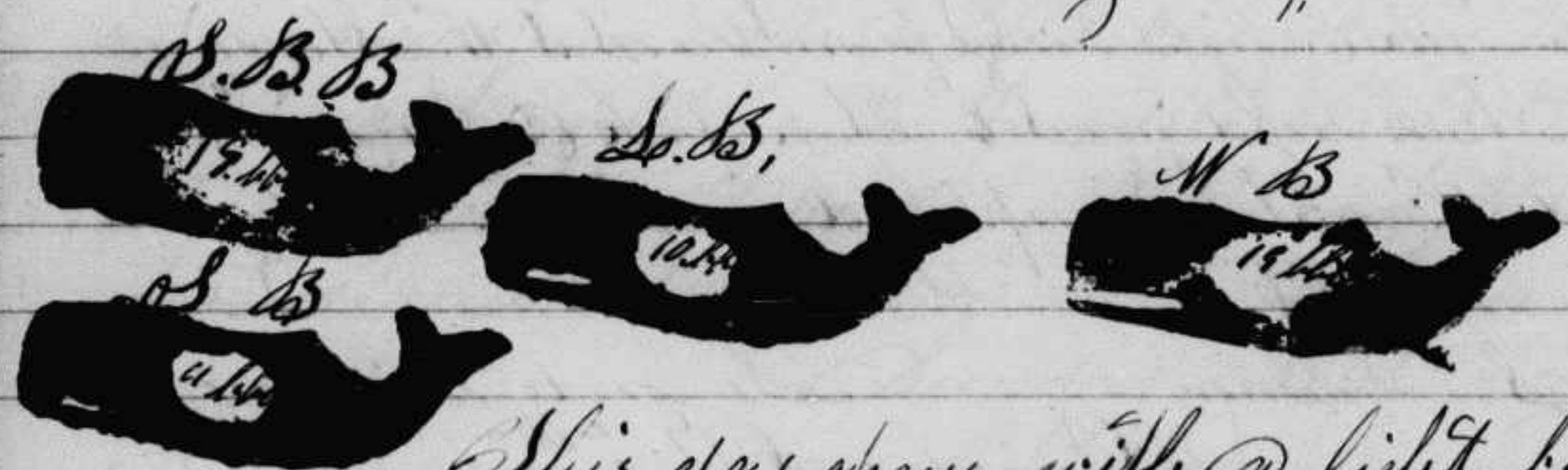


Remarks on Board Bark *Beatha* of New Bedford
 Monday Sept. 11



This day opens with a light breeze from the S.W. Steaming by it on the S. Tack about half past noon. At 10 A.M. about 9 o'clock Mr. Briggs Saw 3 sperm Whales low 3 boats for them about 9 o'clock Mr. Briggs went on and struck a small Whale and the rest of them went to the windward quick about 11 o'clock they started to the leeward one. Martin went on and struck then the second Whale struck one, about that time the Capt. lowered and struck each boat killed these Whales. The 3rd boat went on again and had one missed. Boatman was about sick. Took the 4 Whales along side about four o'clock. I then struck them fast for the night. Then put up the cutting gear and had every thing ready to hook on at day light. So made this day

Monday Sept. 12th

This day opens with a light breeze from the S.W. Steaming by it on the S. Tack with 4 Whales along side at day light commenced to cut them in finished at 12 o'clock. After dinner all hands employed in cutting blubber, clearing away the weeds and started the big Whales and sent down the cutting gear Joseph the Boatman off Duty. Sick talking of this in sight

Lat. 45.45 S. Long 11-10 W. So made this day

Monday Sept. 13th

This day opens with a light breeze from the S.W. Steaming by it on the S. Tack at day light Saw a Merchant Bark about 8 o'clock with the Board made to her it was a Portuguese vessel from St. Pauls Do Loango bound to the Port of St. Thomas with emigrants about 4 o'clock Saw Black fish lowered 2 boats but did not get near them. Watch employed in boiling and oil Joseph off Duty. Lat. 45.45 S. Long 11-10 W. So made this day

Monday Sept. 14th

This day opens with a light breeze from the S.W. Steaming by it on the S. Tack Watch employed in boiling and finished about 4 o'clock. Then Saw Black fish at 12 o'clock went on the S. Tack heading W.

Lat. 45.45 S. Long 10-55 W. So made this day
