Thursday Nov 11th

This day opens with a light breeze from S by E
steering by it on the Star tack from N S W to S W
with all sail except gaff topsail. Watch employed in
repairing the main topsail and fin back in sight
Lat 10-20 S. Long 150-15 W. So ends this day

Friday Nov 12th

This day opens with a light breeze from the S S E
steering by it on the Star tack heading S S W
rather past wind S to Watch finished main topsail
and sent down fore topsail & put the main topsail
in its place. Nothing but porpoises in sight at 9 o'clock
the tack in the top gallant sails heading S W
Lat 10-30 S. Long 14-30 W. So ends this day

Saturday Nov 13th

This day opens with a light breeze from S S E
steering by it on the Star tack heading S W
at daylight made all sail except gaff topsail. Watch
employed in repairing it finished and sent it
at 9 o'clock a line went down on the Star tack at
10 o'clock went back on the Star tack nothing in sight

Lat 11-00 S. Long 15-00 W So ends this day

St. Helens Island Nov 14th

Sunday Nov 14th

This day opens with a good breeze from S S E steering
by it on the Star tack heading S S E with all sail
except main Royal. Nothing in sight

Lat 13-17 S. Long 12-22 W. So ends this day
Monday Nov 15th

This day opens with a good breeze from S S E
steering by it on the Star tack at 12 o'clock went
about on the Star tack nothing in sight. Watch
employed in Ship's Duty

Lat 15-05 S. Long 16-48 W. So ends this day
Tuesday Nov 16th

This day opens with a good breeze from S S E
steering by it making to the windward. Watch employed
in Ship's Duty. Sent down main topsail & staysail
repacked and sent it up again all sail set
except main Royal & sail in sight going to the
Westward

Lat 15-45 S. Long 16-25 W. So ends this day
Wednesday Nov 17th

This day opens with a strong breeze from S S E
steering by it making to the windward. Saw the
Island of St. Helens at 4 o'clock. Mr. Bennett the
St. Bar boat Capt. & family went on shore from
came back with the boat about sunset at 7 o'clock
Shortened sail kept by the wind on the Star tack
heading S. Island bearing South. So ends
